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The trustees are pleased to present their annual report for the year ended 31st March 2016.

The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, Companies Act 2006, and Accounting and Reporting by Charities; Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their account in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Small Entities and Accounting and Reporting by Charities, in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16th July 2014; updated 2nd February 2016, and the Charities Act 2011.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Is to promote for the public benefit, charitable purposes as the trustees shall in their absolute discretion think fit, including in particular but not so as to bind the generality of the foregoing for the public benefit:

- To advance education and enhance employment and training opportunities
- To promote healthy living and to relieve poverty, sickness and distress through the delivery
 of community based services delivered in Merseyside in particular (but not exclusively)
 which may include:

A debt advice service to assist members of the community to manage and reduce debt and to maximise their income and so relieve poverty

A food bank service to provide practical assistance in the relief of poverty and the promotion of healthy living

And such other activities that relieve poverty, sickness and distress and promote healthy living as the trustees shall from time to time determine

To operate community, recreational and leisure time facilities in and around the community
of the church of St Andrew's Clubmoor Liverpool, and in surrounding districts, for the benefit
of the community in Clubmoor in particular, but not exclusively; with the object of improving
their conditions and quality of life without distinction of sex, race, political, religious or other
opinion provided. The charity shall be non-party and shall promote equality of opportunity.

When planning our activities for the year, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

2015/16 has been a difficult year for our community – we have seen an increased level of complexity in the lives of the people we support, and increased levels of need. We have adapted our services and restructured the Network to meet this need. We have also extended our ability to support other churches and community groups to take the journey we have taken over the past 13 years.

In terms of performance we have delivered:

- In depth advice and support to 757 different people with money worries. 410 of these people have been supported in our Roscoe School base, and 347 across our 6 satellite centres. 279 of these cases are new in 2015 / 2016 these new clients are tending to have more long-standing, complex and priority debt and are taking longer to resolve.
- We continue to host the North Liverpool Foodbank. We have fed 7,060 people in the financial year, across 3,346 different families. 1,828 of these have been through our Centre at Roscoe, with the rest distributed across 10 distribution points in North Liverpool.

 We have provided mental health support to 20 people. We have an estimated 150 volunteers working across our Network, with 60 at any one time here at St. Andrew's.

This year we invested in a detailed evaluation and social impact assessment that shows we delivered £29 return for every £1 we have spent – and a total value of £14.4 million. We have directly supported 12,300 people over the three previous years.

In reviewing St. Andrew's Community Network financially, it is important to understand the impact of being the Trusted Local Organisation for MyClubmoor has on our finances. This year we have reconciled the first two years of MyClubmoor project and re-allocated expenditure from previous years. This largely relates to the administrative cost to St. Andrew's Community Network of delivering the MyClubmoor programme. This has a notable impact on the overall profit and loss statement, which shows an overall deficit of £3,625. St. Andrews Community Network itself had a good financial year, with an operating surplus of £12,191 which is being added to the designated fund to reflect the growth of the organization.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The income for the year is £276,686 (2015: £189,740) of which £169,330 (2015: £132,265), related to funding for projects upon which restrictions are placed.

Total expenditure in the year is £280,311(2015: £220,481), leaving a deficit for the year of £3,625 (2015: deficit of £30,741).

At 31st March 2016 the charitable company's reserves stood at £107,933 (2015: £111,558) of which £15,302 (2015: £31,618) represented restricted funds.

Risk Management

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to major risks.

Reserves Policy

The trustees have agreed a reserves policy of amounts that are to be specifically set aside to cover potential redundancy liability and 4 months' provision of operating costs. These have been identified as a designated fund at 31st March 2016, based on our forecast expenditure for the financial year 2016/17.

As at the end of the financial year the balance on unrestricted funds was £92,631 of this £78,976 is designated as staff redundancy and 4 months operating costs. The remaining £13,655 is being held to ensure smooth cash-flow, as a contingency for unexpected expenditure, and to provide for future investment activity.

Plans for the future

We are delighted to announce that Henry Smith Charity will be continuing their support for the next two years, and welcome Comic Relief and the Morgan Foundation as supporters. We are grateful for the certainty that their support provides. We also benefit hugely from smaller trusts and foundations that make a substantial contribution to our work. We'd like to thank them for the difference their funding has made.

We have continued our policy of increasing revenue and donations. This year we have successfully tendered and operated a commercial contract for Liverpool City Council debt advice services, and are partnering with three Foodbanks on the Every One Counts campaign.

We continue to pursue the purchase of a local building to act as our headquarters, but have secured our current premises for at least another 12 months.

We have restructured our staff team to deliver our objectives for 2016 / 17. We have taken the step of appointing a chief executive officer to lead our development. Julie-Anne Wanless, our longest serving staff member, is changing her role to work directly advising clients. We have recruited a full-time operations manager to ensure the day-to-day management of the company.

We are a well-managed and well-governed organisation. This year we refreshed our Advice Quality Standard accreditation.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 1st October 2003 as Clubmoor Community Support and registered as a charity on 4th August 2004. The company was renamed St Andrew's Community Network on 14th August 2012. The Governing Instruments under which the charitable company operates comprise the Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 1st October 2003, amended by special resolution dated 13th February 2013.

The Parochial Church Council of Clubmoor St Andrews is entitled to appoint and remove up to, but not exceeding, five individuals from the office of director. These appointments do not require an ordinary resolution. Other individuals may be elected as directors by ordinary resolution at any general meeting.

I report on the accounts of the charitable company for the year ended 31st March 2016, which are set out on pages 8 to 19.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. It is my responsibility to:

1. Limited Liability

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. Each member's liability is limited to £10.

2. Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities, in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16th July 2014; updated 2nd February 2016, and the Charities Act 2011.

Going Concern

The Trustees have reasonable expectation that the company will be able to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future.

Funds Accounting

Unrestricted funds are the charity's free reserves available for the trustees to distribute in accordance with the charitable company's charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific restrictive conditions imposed by the donor. All restricted funds are accounted for as restricted income and expenditure for the purposes is charged to the fund.

Income recognition

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, there is sufficient certainty of receipt and so it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Donations and legacies comprise of donations and general grants which are recognised in the accounts when received, with the exception of known legacies which are accounted for when their receipt is certain.

Income from charitable activities is recognised on an accruals basis. Grants receivable are recognised on the date on which their unconditional payment is confirmed by the donor.

Income from other trading activities relates to fundraising income and transport hire and is recognised when the amount is certain.

Expenditure recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charitable company to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. All expenses, including support costs and governance costs, are allocated or apportioned to the applicable expenditure headings in the Statement Of Financial Activities. Support and governance costs are applied to unrestricted funds unless specifically included in the restrictions, as specified by the donor.

Fixed Assets

Capital expenditure of £250 and above is stated in the balance sheet at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life as below:

Taxation

Income and gains are exempt from taxation as they are applied for charitable purposes only. The charity benefits from various exemptions from taxation afforded by tax legislation and is not liable to corporation tax on income or gains falling within those exemptions. The charity is not able to recover Value Added Tax. Expenditure is recorded in the accounts inclusive of VAT.

Description of Funds

These are funds to be expended at the discretion of the Board of Trustees for specific charitable purposes, as follows:

Big Local – My Clubmoor – Funds being held by St Andrew's Community Network as a trusted local organisation on behalf of the My Clubmoor partnership board. My Clubmoor is a big local trust area.

Church Welfare Association – Grant for the provision of mental health services for women in our community.

Community Foundation – Grant from the Mark McQueen for the provision of mental health services to men.

Eat Well Spend Less – Part of Trussel Trust's More Than Food initiative, extending foodbank provision into cookery with nutrition and financial education.

Henry Smith – Contribution of two part-time debt advisers as part of the wider money management project.

John Moores Foundation – Project in which we provide high-quality, free debt advice, quality-assured through the community legal services quality mark.

Liverpool Charity and Voluntary Services – Small grant for the provision of welfare benefits training to volunteers.

Liverpool City Council - Community Resources Unit – work in partnership with St. Andrew's Church to deliver a 'stronger communities' project including community events, regular community recreational activities and volunteering programme.
