The Parish of St Peter, Notting Hill Annual Report and Financial Statements For the year ended 31 December 2015

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Background

On 31 December 2003, under the provisions of a Pastoral Scheme, the former Parish of St John and St Peter, Notting Hill, was dissolved. In its place two new Parishes of St John, Notting Hill, and St Peter, Notting Hill, were created with effect from 1 January 2003. In addition, the Notting Hill Group Ministry was established with these new parishes as its members.

Administrative information

The Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St Peter, Notting Hill, (referred to as The Parish of St Peter, Notting Hill) is a charity registered with the Charity Commission under the Charity Registration number 1133807.

Structure, governance and management

The Governing documents of the Parish of St Peter, Notting Hill are the Parochial Church Council (Powers) Measure 1956 and the Church Representation Rules.

Members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) are either ex-officio or elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in accordance with the Church Representation Rules.

Objectives and activities

The Church exists to witness the good news of the God made known in Jesus Christ. St Peter's seeks to be open to God and relevant to the needs of the neighbourhood.

The Church continues to be well used and we are pleased with the number of community groups that use the building. We charge a minimal amount for this use, as what we want to develop is a weaving together of community groups.

The Parish continues to aim to give 10% of its income from Planned Giving away in support of mission activities but will only do so when an overall surplus is generated.

The PCC could not achieve its objectives without the invaluable contribution of numerous volunteers and helpers throughout the year.

Given the charitable status of the Parish, the PCC have given due consideration to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on Public Benefit.

Membership

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. The members of the PCC are regarded as the trustees of the charity.

On 31 December 2015 Mark Hargreaves left the Church after 18 years to take up the role of Pastor at St John's by the Sea in California. Both Mark and his wife Laura have made a considerable contribution to the development of the Church during their time at St Peter's and have inspired many people along the way. They will be missed by everyone connected with St Peter's and we wish them every success and happiness in California.

As a result the Church is in an Interregnum and the task of appointing a new Vicar is well underway. In the meantime the Churchwardens have taken on the responsibilities of the Vicar during the Interregnum with the assistance of members of the PCC and other members of the congregation.

Review of the year and our achievements and performance

2015 was as ever a busy year for St Peter's. During the year in addition to our main service at 10:30am, the monthly 9:00am service was complemented with the 6:00pm service, which became fully established. With these services it has meant that we have been able to cover a rich diet of the Bible across the year.

We continue to put a lot of energy and effort into celebrating the major Christian festivals during the year. This saw the Palm Sunday parade grow in numbers as St Peter's and St John's were joined by the congregation of St Georges, Campden Hill. The parade was led by donkey called Wayne.

Our programme of Christmas services drew an increasingly large crowd across Notting Hill attracted by the variety and musical quality of the services. The highlight is our main carol service where musicians, led by Peter Yarde Martin, went to particular effort to create a memorable service. The Christmas Day service was tinged with sadness as it was Mark's last formal service with us.

Another landmark that is important in our annual church life is St Peter's Day, which we celebrate with a program of activities over the weekend nearest to the day.

The St Peter's congregation do not underestimate the benefits of fellowship. Numerous events are held throughout the year, which are well attended not only by the congregation but local residents as well.

The Church is extremely active in promoting our faith to the wider community who visit us. Our relationship with the homeless charity, The 240 project, continued with a successful exhibition of their works in the gallery.

St Peter's Nursery School continues to be a warm welcoming haven to children and their families. Tracey Lloyd took over the role of head in the summer. The Nursery is a vibrant and happy place where dedicated staff attend well to each child's individual needs. The Nursery wants to build on its good reputation and make its presence better known within the local community.

As part of our Public Benefit approach the Nursery adheres to the tenants of the ethos of the Church in that it aims to make education accessible to as many families as possible.

Church Attendance

At the end of the year, there were 215 people (2014 - 204) on the Church electoral roll. On a typical Sunday there are approximately 120 adults and 80 children and young people. Rosemary Conway continued to act as the Electoral Roll Officer.

Financial Review

The Parish suffered a loss of \pounds 14,487 in the year. The loss is entirely due to capital expenditure in relation to the restoration of the Façade, work on the Gallery and repairs to the boilers. Fundraising has commenced to raise the \pounds 240,000 needed to complete the Façade restoration project.

The PCC aims to operate on the basis of living within its means over a medium term period whilst continuing to support other missions and charities. The PCC is heavily dependent and reliant upon direct giving and its policy is to continue to increase this amount over the medium term.

With this in mind the PCC will during the early part of 2016 undertake a strategic review of the projected financial position of the Church over the next 2 to 3 years with a view to determining what actions to take in the medium term to increase the income of the Church to enable the new Vicar and the PCC to continue and enhance the good work currently undertaken.

Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the PCC to maintain unrestricted reserves in the region of £60,000, which equates to approximately six months operational expenditure excluding the payment to the Diocese of London Common Fund.

The reserves have fallen below this level due in part to capital expenditure following on from the Development Project and on the Façade restoration. It is the intention of the PCC to return the level of unrestricted reserves to in excess of \pounds 60,000 in the future.

Details on the restricted, designated and unrestricted reserves of the Church are set out in note 9 to the accounts.

Investment Policy

It is the policy of the PCC to invest funds in an instant access deposit account with the CBF Church of England Fund. Remaining funds are held with Unity Trust Bank plc.

Future Plans

The Church continues with its aim to create a strong community life together, meet pastoral needs and nurture faith. We want to make progress on our spiritual journey both as individuals and as a Church.

2016 will be a challenging year for all involved with the Church as we will be in an Interregnum until such time as a new vicar is appointed. That process is underway and will hopefully be completed by the end of the year.

During the year we will be looking to expand the extent of a youth work and in particular ensuring that we continue to have as many young people as possible involved in the Church as they grow up.

There will also be two major initiatives with regard to fundraising.

The first is in respect of the Facade Project. Following the latest quinquennial review of the fabric of the Church it is clear that Facade requires extensive restoration work to prevent further damage and restore it to its former glory. Having completed the restoration of the inside of the Church some years ago it is now time to turn attention to the outside of the Church.

Coupled with this will be initiatives to raise the ongoing income of the Church not only by planned giving but other means as well. It is clear that we need to implement the strategy to increase the overall income of the Church to enable surpluses to be generated and put aside the future capital expenditure.

Risk Assessment

As part of its ongoing overview the PCC considers risks that the Parish is exposed to and takes steps to ensure there are systems to mitigate those risks. The approach adopted by the PCC is to consider different categories of risk, namely risks related to financial, regulatory, statutory, legal and operational matters. The PCC has also mandated a separate committee to oversee the operation of the Nursery.

PCC responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The PCC are responsible for preparing an Annual Report and Financial Statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The PCC is required by law to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Parish and of the incoming resources and application of resources for that period.

In preparing those financial statements the PCC is required to:

- Observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- Prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Parish will continue to operate

The PCC is also responsible for:

- Preparing and preserving financial statements which comply with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 and the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008;
- Keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Parish;
- Safeguarding the assets of the Parish, and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detections of fraud and other irregularities.

Report of the Independent Examiner to The Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St Peter, Notting Hill

I report on the financial statements of the Church for the year ended 31 December 2015 which are set out on pages 9 to 21.

This report is made solely to the PCC, as a body, in accordance with Section 145 of the Charities Act 2011 and regulations made under Section 154 of that Act. My work has been undertaken so that I might state to the members of the PCC those matters I am required to state to them in an Independent Examiner's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, I do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Parish and the PCC as a body, for my work or for this report.

Respective responsibilities of the PCC and Independent Examiner

As explained more fully in the Statement of Responsibilities of the PCC set out on page 6, the PCC is responsible for the preparation of financial statements. The PCC consider that an audit is not required for this year under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 and that an Independent Examination is needed. The gross income exceeded \pounds 250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

It is my responsibility to:

- Examine those financial statements under Section 145 of the Charities Act 2011.
- Follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission under Section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act 2011.
- State whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Report

My examination was carried out in accordance with General Directions given by the Charity Commission.

That examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the Parish and a comparison of the financial statements prepared with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the financial statements and seeking explanations from you as members of the PCC concerning any such matters.

The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the financial statements present a true and fair view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

The Parish of St Peter, Notting Hill Accounting Convention For the year ended 31 December 2015

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with:

- The Church Accounting Regulations 2006;
- The Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (Charities SORP (FRS102)) issued on 16 July 2014 and effective from 1 January 2015; and
- The Charities Act 2011.

The Parish is a Public Benefit Entity.

The financial statements have been prepared in Sterling, which is the functional currency of the Parish.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with SORP FRS102 as it applies to the financial statements of the Parish for the year ended 31 December 2015.

The Parish transitioned from UK GAAP to SORP FRS102 as at 1 January 2014. The policies applied under the previous accounting framework by the Parish are not materially different to those under SORP FRS102 and have therefore not impacted on the net assets or results.

Going concern

The PCC considers that there are no material uncertainties about the Parish's ability to continue as a going concern.

The Parish of St Peter, Notting Hill Accounting Policies For the year ended 31 December 2015

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

Fund accounting

General funds, including those generated from the Under Three's Drop In, represent the funds of the Church that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application on the general purposes of the Church.

Designated funds represent funds of the Church that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use but that have been set aside by the PCC for a specific purpose of the Church. These funds are in respect of a legacy, which has been designated for capital works.

Restricted funds are subject to restrictions regarding their use. These funds are in respect of:

- St Peter's Nursery School and represent funds that relate to the operations of the Nursery School.
- The Façade Project and represent funds that relate to fundraising in respect of the restoration of the Façade of the Church.

Income

Voluntary income

Planned giving is recognised only when received. Collections and donations are recognised when they are received. Tax recoverable on Gift Aid giving is recognised when the donations to which they relate are received. Legacy income is recognised only when received.

Income from Church events and activities

Parents' contributions and government funding to St Peter's Nursery School are recognised on an accruals basis. All other income is recognised when received.

Investment income

Interest on funds held on deposit income is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably.

Services from volunteers

The value of such services is not recognised in the financial statements as it cannot be reasonably quantified.

The Parish of St Peter, Notting Hill Accounting Policies For the year ended 31 December 2015

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Irrecoverable VAT is charged as a cost against the activity for which the expenditure was incurred. Expenditure is classified under the principal activities of the Church.

Allocation of support costs

Support costs are those functions that assist the work of the Church but do not directly undertake charitable activities. Support costs include office costs, premises costs, personnel and governance costs. These costs have been allocated to the principal activities of the Church.

Diocese of London Common Fund

The Parish's contributions to the Diocese of London Common Fund are accounted for when paid as they are a gift form the Parish.

Fixed assets

Consecrated property and moveable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the accounts by Section 10(2) to (4) of the Charities Act 2011. All expenditure on consecrated or beneficed buildings and on movable Church furnishings, whether maintenance or improvement, is written off.

Moveable church furnishings held by the Vicar and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a faculty for disposal, are accounted as inalienable property while consecrated. For inalienable property there is insufficient cost information available, and therefore such assets are not valued in the accounts.

Equipment

Equipment is stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on a straight line basis over four years. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of $\pounds 1,000$ or less are written off when the asset is acquired.

Debtors and prepayments

Debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due, less provision for amounts that may prove uncollectable. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Creditors falling due within one year

Creditors are recognised where there is a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.

Financial instruments

The Parish only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of loans, which are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Leasing

Rental payments under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In the application of the Parish's accounting policies, the Parish is required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised, if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The PCC considers that there were no estimates and assumptions which have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets and liabilities.

14. VOLUNTEERS' SERVICES AND ST PETER'S NURSERY

In all its various activities the PCC is dependent upon the services of unpaid volunteers. The value of such services is not recognised in the financial statements as it cannot be reasonably quantified.

The Nursery also enjoys immense support from the parents of the children attending the Nursery. The parents are responsible for organising a variety of fund raising activities and the funds raised are allocated in accordance with the wishes of the parents committee.

The operation of St Peter's Nursery is also dependent on the support of the St. Peter's Hall (1991) Charity, which provides premises at no cost to the Nursery. The value of this support during the year has been estimated at \pounds 40,000.
