Trustees' Report

296085

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2016. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charities trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities published in 2005.

Structure, governance and management

The Society is a registered charity, number 296085 and is constituted and governed by Society rules. The charities principal activity during the year continued to be advancing the study of French Porcelain of all periods and to further public knowledge and appreciation of it.

Trustees are appointed by members of the society. Voting takes place annually at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) usually held in June. Trustees are eligible for reappointment every year at the AGM and remain in office, until either their position is challenged or they resign. A current list of trustees and their roles is contained in the information page.

Financial Review

The society is self-funding and in addition to income raised via membership subscriptions, Seminars and visits are organised each year to enable appreciation of French Porcelain.

The general fund is unrestricted and are spent as Trustees see fit for purpose to meet the aims of the Society.

The Special fund, Publications fund, Mavis Watney Bequest and Sir Geoffrey de Bellaige Bequest are all restricted funds and monies are spent in accordance with the each fund's purpose.

Main Objectives

The main objective of the society is to further the study and appreciation of French Porcelain of all periods. The trustees confirm that they have given due regard to the guidance published by the charities commission guidance on public benefit in deciding what activities the Society undertakes.

Aims are fulfilled with an active programme of lectures, symposia and visits to collections in England and abroad. Scholarly journals and regular newsletters are also produced to help achieve the Society aims.

Another successful year has been achieved despite the general financial climate. Membership Subscriptions remained fairly constant. During the year a book published by David Peters was produced which generated additional income for the society and Journal 5, Three Centuries at Sevres, has now been produced.

Accounting and reporting responsibilities

The charity trustees are responsible for preparing an annual report and financial statements in accordance with the applicable law and UK GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. The Charities Act 2011 requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to;

- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue as a going concern

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Standard of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005) an applicable UK accounting Standards and the Charities Act 2011.

Income

All incoming resources are recognised once the charity has an entitlement to the resources, it is certain that the resources will be received and the monetary value of the incoming resources can be measured with sufficient reliability

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as resources expended as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for an on accruals basis and has been classified under the headings that aggregate all costs relating to that category.

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.
