Secretary's Report 2015

In 2015 we have continued to develop our Church as a place of Christian worship and a hub for a wide range of Community activities. The Food Bank, Café Oasis and Advance Credit Union collection point have operated throughout the year. Moreover in September 2015, thanks to startup funding from the national and regional United Reformed Church, we established a Parish Nurse service; based on our church premises but serving the whole community. During the year we carried out a major refurbishment of the Church Centre by replacing old metal framed, single glazed windows with modern double glazed units. This considerably improved the energy efficiency in that part of the building and reduced maintenance costs. The cost of the work was generously supported by Sutton Coldfield Charitable Trust and the Joseph Scott Trust. Church membership increased to 144 and numbers attending the main Church Services on Sundays and Tuesdays remained fairly constant at approx.100 and 25 respectively. During the year we hosted two special Church services on behalf of the West Midlands URC Synod – in July the retirement service for the Synod Moderator the Rev'd Roy Lowes and in September we hosted the Induction Service for his successor the Rev'd Steve Faber. In October 2015 a group from the Church under the auspices of the Vine Trust spent two-weeks in Tanzania working on a project to build homes for people in poorer rural communities. Funds for this trip and the project had been raised by the Church during 2014 and 2015. The Church continued to host a wide range of groups, activities and events on the premises including Scouts, Guides, etc.; The University of the Third Age and a range of concerts and meetings for community groups.

Governance

Elders' Meetings took place each month and a Church Meeting was held every two months. Moving the Church Meeting to a Sunday immediately after the morning service greatly improved attendance and participation. In addition meetings of the Church Life committee, Finance & Property committee, Café Oasis Management committee, Church Communications Group and Pastoral Group took place on a regular basis. As is our practice, all significant decisions were made after discussion at the relevant committee, the Elders' Meeting and where appropriate Church Meeting.

Plans

In 2016 the Church intends to continue to maintain and improve its buildings for the benefit of the congregation and the local community and to consider other ways in which it can develop its mission in Sutton Coldfield.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 1993 Section 42(3), using the Receipts and Payments basis available to small charities, and the United Reformed Church guidance.

This is the first year that a Receipts and Payments Account has been prepared, in accordance with advice from URC West Midlands Synod. Comparitives have been restated where necessary.

2 FUND ACCOUNTING

Unrestricted Funds may be used by the church for any of its ordinary purposes.

Designated Funds represent unrestricted funds set aside by the church for specific designated purposes; they can be transferred back into general funds at the church's decision.

10 ASSETS USED FOR CHURCH PURPOSES

The church building and the manse at 137 Birmingham Road, Sutton Coldfield are vested in URC West Midlands Synod Trust as Trustees and are not church assets. They are held for the benefit of Sutton Coldfield United Reformed Church in accordance with the statutory trusts applicable to URC properties under the URC Acts. For insurance purposes the church buildings are insured by the Church for £5,588,791 and the manse for £487,619. The church contents are insured by the church fo £274,223. The sum insured for the organ £661,012.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

I report on the financial statements of SUTTON COLDFIELD URC for the year ended 31 December 2015, which are set out on pages 1 to 3.

Respective responsibilities

The church is responsible for the preparation of the financial statements, and considers that the audit requirement of Section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act) does not apply. It is my responsibility to state, on the basis of procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under Section 43(7)(b) of the Act, whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions of the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the church and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the financial statements, and seeking explanations concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the financial statements.

Independent Examiner's statement

In connection with my examination of the church funds, nothing came to my attention which gave me cause to believe otherwise than that the financial statements accord with the accounting records of the church, and that those records satisfied the requirements of the Act. I am not aware of any matter to which attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the financial statements to be reached.
