We continue to work with the elderly of the district.

We are grateful to Hilary Lister our secretary who has done sterling work processing grant applications and continues to produce the Sentinel our news letter giving information to elderly people, street wardens and local organisations.

Our Treasurer Mark Anderson who continues to keep our accounts in order and negotiates our utility services contracts.

Brenda Jackson Baker our president who continues to give practical support for fund raising activities.

Also I thank all the members of the committee who give their time and support during the year.

Day Centre Report:

We provide home style fresh cooked meals four days a week with social activities and outings. More and more people benefit from the warmth and friendship.

Our mini bus is adapted for wheel chair users enabling many housebound clients to come to the Day Centre.

Because of the central position of the Day Centre our clients can visit The Doctors, Chemist, Bank, shops and the Market at the same time.

The Centre would not be possible without our volunteers.

Firstly my husband David who is my right hand man, bringing me to the centre, preparing vegetables and weekly visits to the cash and carry.

Gerry Grainger who has worked 3 days a week for at least 10 years.

Bobby Porter who works every day. Christine Collins, Pauline, Lorraine, Linda and Steff who work one or two days a week preparing and serving meals and washing up. Gill Placket and her husband Brian who clean the centre and perform maintenance tasks. Also Denis Door continues to help and fills in when people are off sick.

We are most grateful to our drivers, Ken Morgan, Mick Ellett and Arthur Williams who's commitment and care is appreciated.

Thanks go to George Langhorn our Day Centre treasurer and Mary Shepherd who takes the money two days a week and runs the Bingo.

Nobody at the day Centre gets paid so we rely solely on volunteers.
