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#### Trustees' Report For the year ended 31st March 2016

Restricted funds are set aside as shown in the Statement of Financial Activities on page 3. All other monies are treated as general funds and are utilised accordingly. The charity will aim to maintain at all times a free reserve up to 25% of its annual budget as an emergency reserve.
