Every year we need to recruit new committee members. These can be parents or a parent's representative, you are able to remain on the committee for up to a year after your child has left. There have been a number of parents step down so to continue our work we need to adopt some new members. To be a member you need to be willing to supply the Charity Commission your names, addresses and dates of birth. DBS clearance checks must be performed for all Trustees. Last year had been very successful for Blendon Preschool.

We I looked into the funding we received from the local authority and the change to 3 hour sessions has made a big difference in the settings claims. Unfortunately there is still a short fall on the funded fees as this does not cover the minimum wage in staffing, so we needed to evaluate the private fees once again, increasing this by a further 50p to £12.50 per session. I am pleased to say we are still one of the lowest charging like-for-like preschools in the area.

The fundraising last year was phenomenal, the kind donations from sponsors such as petty freeman estates, Morrison's, Tesco's, the chunky teapot and other small businesses in Sidcup and Blackfen see a fundraising total exceed £2000.

We were able to buy a tablet for preschool use, send staff on training for sign along and special educational needs, buy new toys and equipment for the pre-schoolers, fund their Christmas gifts and celebrate the queens 90th birthday by presenting each child with a coin.

The preschool relies on the fundraising for all these extras to make the children's experiences memorable ones.

For this I would like to express a real heartfelt 'Thank You' to all of you and to all the staff that have worked beyond the call of duty, to make us one of the most reputable preschools in the area.

4. <u>Matters arising</u>

Purpose of meeting

Blendon preschool has run as a committee run playgroup for over 30 years. In 2014 it was brought to our attention that we were not registered with the Charity Commission. In order to operate we need to have a number of parents on the committee to make decisions and take votes. To keep 2 staff members on the committee we need to have at least a parent:staff ratio of 4:1. Today we will be looking at how many parents are resigning and if any new parents are willing to join the committee. We need to look at electing a Parent representative and we already have an Ofsted representative in Georgia Wilds as Preschool manager. Finally we will discuss the visions and goals for fundraising and any future spending.

Resignations

The following committee members have decided to resign as their children are no longer attending the preschool. Sue Petty, Nikita Petty-Hart, Ellie Thompson and Rachel Carpenter. Therefore we are looking to replace those 4 members at least.

New Committee Members

Claire Nicholson, Sarah Young, Mr. and Mrs. Vousdon have all come forward as new trustees. We are therefore able to keep Georgia Wilds and Margaret Hodgson on the committee, who will be unable to vote in any monetary decisions.

Parent Representative

There needs to be a parent representative so that other preschool parents can contact them if they feel the need to. Most parents would speak directly to the staff however there may be something anonymous that they may wish to discuss. Georgia will create a new email address for parents to contact the parent rep by email if needed. Claire Nicholson is willing to take this role. A unanimous decision is reached that Claire will be the parent rep for the year of 2016/17.

Ofsted

As a preschool registered with Ofsted we are constantly being monitored by the regulators. We have recently had a small mock inspection by Bexley council and are doing very well there are just a few operational in house changes that need to be addressed and staff are already in the process of dealing with these matters. Our inspection is due anytime in the cycle of 2015-2020 however looking at the past we seem to be inspected roughly every 4 years. This would mean that Blendon Preschool will probably be inspected in the Spring of 2017.

From our little mock we were asked to adjust the snacks so the children are buttering or cutting their own bread or fruit, Georgia asks the committee how they feel about this and it was agreed that it's a good way of teaching them about utensils and their uses.

We were also told that the small hall is not provision tested by Ofsted so in the event of us having to move the setting to the small hall due to lack of heating or anything similar we need to advise Ofsted and let them make the decision if we should operate from there or not. Committee suggests perhaps having the hall provision tested for every eventuality, Georgia will look into this and report back in due course.

DBS

Disclosure Barring Service (DBS). Members of the committee must hold a DBS certificate, an email will be sent out with the details. This allows you to work with the preschool at a volunteer status. The cost is around £9 and the preschool will

Year to end

We have the figures here for the year ending August 2016. Our primary goal was to try and keep preschool funds up to a sensible reserve. This was achieved in a number of ways. We looked into the funding we received from the local authority and the change to 3 hour sessions has made a big difference in the settings claims. Unfortunately there is still a short fall on the funded fees as this does not cover the minimum wage in staffing, so we needed to evaluate the private fees once again, increasing this by a further 50p to £12.50 per session. 5. Any Other Business

Visions and Goals

Georgia advised that the preschool needs to raise funds to purchase further tablets for use by the children and replace some old and worn toys. We also want to get a new smartphone that enables us to read and download emails and attachment files and/or a modem for accessing the internet at the setting. Mrs Vousdon kindly said she would ask her husband how this worked and get back to us. The preschool relies heavily on fundraising to purchase new resources for the children as income raised from session fees is used for staff wages and hall rental. Georgia advised the committee that we are having a small stall at Sidcup Towns fete and any proceeds will be going to the preschool and that we also have a prize for a Christmas card competition that we entered. The Christmas raffle is fast approaching and we have already got many prizes such as gift vouchers. Jacki has kindly offered to try and get a Christmas Hamper from Lidl. Tickets go on sale next week.

Georgia has also set up the uniform shop with Tesco direct as this will enable the preschool to collect any cashback from purchases made.

Some of the following ideas were also put forward:

RAISING ADDITIONAL FUNDS

- Voluntary donation box at school
- Asking for arts and crafts supplies
- Increasing ticket face value for the raffle from £5 to £10 for each child (voluntary and parents can return unused tickets)
- Graduation teddy bear/ gift
- Xmas cards/personalised plates or mugs

SCHOOL DAY OUT

- Farm
- Library
- Theatre

Parents to drop off and/or pickup plus volunteer

- See when the school is 50 years old for a summer fete

Georgia would like more male involvement from families and asked for any ideas, some sort of Dads/Grandads day. Committee members suggested perhaps we have a friend and family days and job and profession talks.

Georgia is currently investigating whether we need to register the charity to the pensions charter for the staff.
