The Trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2016.

Risk Management

The Trustees has assessed the major risks to which the Organisation incorporated in England and Wales is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The Organisation incorporated in England and Wales's objects are COVO Connecting Voices is an educational charity with a track record in delivering highly effective tailored training programmes that support schools and organisations address conflict, disaffection and underachievement in education and the community. We work holistically with children, young people, their families, the elderly and relevant professionals in public and voluntary sectors. Our Services include:

Creative learning programmes in Early Years

CPD for teachers to use play, art, movement & storytelling in the curriculum Tailored programmes for parents that develop confidence and skills to support their children's learning and development

Improving Play & Behaviour provision in primary schools

Training for lunchtime staff to engage children in games and effectively manage the playground Consulting children, staff and parents about how the playground is organised, designed and involving them in decision-making Mentoring school staff and members of senior management to sustain new playground structure

Supporting Transition from primary to secondary schools

Working with whole classes or small groups of children/young people to prepare and equip them with the skills and confidence to be able to move smoothly from primary to secondary school, and remain on track in their secondary education.

Preventive Interventions with disengaged young people at risk of NEET (not in education, employment or training) in schools and Pupil Referral Units

We offer highly skilled interventions consisting in one to one support tailored to individual learning needs, movement and group based learning that support young people to develop social skills, self awareness and the ability to manage feelings effectively.

Creative Learning Programmes in the community

We provide workshops and projects for children, young people and adults using visual and performing arts, dance and movement to explore themes of self, identity, history and the community in which we live. - COVO runs Black History Month workshops, dance and movement based projects in schools and out-ofschool Heritage projects for young people to research their local area and learn oral history techniques.

Movement Programmes for the Elderly

Workshops are designed to improve fitness and general well-being while supporting those who may experience feelings of isolation and loneliness.

Sessions are socially engaging and use group discussions to explore themes related to themselves, and the community in which they live.

INSETs & CPD Training

COVO bespoke training is suitable for all those working with children and young people in educational settings, and is tailored to the needs of the organisation.

Programmes include behaviour management and practice; using play, art, movement & storytelling in the curriculum; whole school approaches; staff and child development.

Dance and Movement Psychotherapy

COVO professional dance and movement psychotherapists work with individuals or groups of adults/children to explore blockages to learning, develop better relationships, trust and self-esteem. We provide programmes specifically designed to support students to reengage in their learning environment.

There has been no change in these objects during the year.

Investment policy

The Trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Organisation incorporated in England and Wales should undertake.

Financial review

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
