NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Allocation and apportionment of costs

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Short leasehold - at variable rates on reducing balance

Musical instruments - 25% on reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings - 25% on reducing balance
Motor vehicles - 25% on reducing balance
Office equipments - 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

We need to escape from corruption by learning to be faithful. When we are faithful, walking and practicing the Kingdom of God, we are partakers of the divine nature.

To become rich you start small and go up step by step. You can only be rich by saving money. Financial breakthrough comes by saving money little by little not short period. The preaching that you must have a house, this and that and yet a person is straight from school or just starting work will cause a person who does not have a house to feel poor. It is not good preaching. It will cause many people to go and borrow and then suffer. In our ministry we do not encourage that kind of preaching.

You only become rich through saving money. To be rich is having enough to eat, enough to send children to school, enough clothes for children, enough to pay bills. You are very rich. All extra is for helping others and your church.

My prayer and desire is for you to prosper in and out.

Let us as usual in all ten days of prayer and fasting have chains of prayer bands and have prayer conventions from 8-10 January 2015.

NATIONAL SUMMARY

The 2014 totals have been included to facilitate a national comparison with current 2015 totals.

We are gradually seeing the evidence of statistics being used as a management tool. This is a positive development that the nation will continue to cultivate through training and feedback. Without careful statistical analysis at local level there's a danger of using figures that will distort measurement of progress or resource allocation and mislead the decision making process.


- 1. Leadership: The totals have continued to decrease, 588 (2013); 579 (2014) 572 (2015). This is partly due to appointment and ordination of Elders being put on hold by the National Executive whilst the current leadership is being trained in effective leadership and attending UKMFCC.
- 2. Membership: There is a generalized increase in all ministries. The overall total increased by 129 from 2014, though 26 less than increase from 2013 to 2014.

3. Activities:

144 new converts were reported against a total membership increase of 129. The very low totals in water and Holy Spirit baptisms compared to 2014 can only be attributed to inaccurate reporting.

Every province will continue to be assisted in appreciating the power of collecting reliable statistics and analysis, so as to quickly identify and correct any misleading information being obtained.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The grace of God continued to abound and we are excited that a new assembly was born in Mansfield which now has 31 committed members. There are powerful testimonies through the working of Home Talents, people who managed to build houses and start businesses; those who were enslaved by credit cards paying them off and are now free. Despite the challenges of venue and work patterns, believers across the province continued to meet for prayer on Mondays and Fridays. Regions managed to hold conventions and conferences, i.e. Ten Days, Easter, Church Anniversary and the June Prayer Conventions for the first time. Attendance was awesome and we saw the hand of God. Deliverance and healing services were effectively conducted in all regions when Evangelist Dr Ezekiel (Jr) and Pastor Carol graced our province during their tour of duty in the nation. God used him mightily and a child who was unable to walk for two years was healed in Nottingham Region.

We also conducted revivals in our Province and saw the hand of God when 3 people were granted their immigration status following years of refusal. One woman received a miracle and delivered a bouncing baby girl naturally the very night she was prayed for when she was overdue and was scheduled to deliver by Caesarean Section.

Regional Child Evangelism conferences were held and 20 children received Christ. We also had our annual Young Generation conference in Wales, where young people were delivered from demonic attacks and speakers took time counselling and equipping the young people with the word of God. The Youth Ministry of Wolverhampton, Leicestershire and Birmingham held worship nights that saw many being delivered and 16 youth receiving Christ as their personal savior. Single Women also had a powerful worship night, where God healed and delivered five women from spiritual husband attacks. Go Quickly and Tell had a powerful prayer retreat which was attended by 150 women, with a massive deliverance and mighty move of the Holy Ghost. Men of Integrity held three meetings and also a power packed retreat in Wales. A FAMB fun day was held in Coventry, attended by 133 parents and children. It was a wonderful time for families as they played games and engaged in activities together. Girls held a powerful conference in October, attended by 60. We are very excited to report an average increase in tithes by 47% which can only be the doing of the Lord. We thank the God of our Father that in Leicestershire we now have a building that has been leased for 25 years, enabling the church to freely conduct services without disruptions and limitations 24 hours a day.

By continued grace and mercies of the God of our father Ezekiel Guti, we are believing for more souls to come to Christ and the growth of our finances in 2016.



PRAYER: Monday & Fridays prayer meetings are being held across the province at assembly and regional levels with attendance affected by varying working patterns, especially Fridays. All Monday free will offering is directed towards Missions. Some regions faced venue challenges.

PCs: 4 meetings were held and the major highlights were Pastor's Deeper Life feedback, Missions, teaching on Guidance, Rules & Policy and Home Talents.

TEN DAYS PRAYER CONVENTIONS:

Regions planned and organised well for their prayer days and prayer convention, for the church to enter into 2015 and walk in their inheritance, practicing the kingdom. Every region had guest speakers who were mightily used of God in deliverance, healing and the word of knowledge and an increase in attendance reported during prayer convention.

YOUTH EASTER CONVENTIONS: This year the Youth held their own convention in Wales. The attendance was high, overall it was a great success and the church experienced a great move of the Holy Spirit, with testimonies of breakthroughs, deliverance and healing. They had many teachers of the word from the Youth, Advisors and their Youth Pastors, the main speaker being Student Pastor Tapiwa Ziswa who preached on forgiveness. There was an opportunity for deep bible studies in the mornings as the delegates were in camp for the conference.

ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS: All Regions celebrated the founding of the church as well as the life of the founder the Servant and Apostle of God who turned 92 this year.

The celebrations included the reading of the history, dramas, choirs, testimonies, cakes cutting, food and singing. Birmingham Region organised a march on the last day of the celebration.

ELDERS' & DEACONS' PRAYER CONVENTIONS: Prayers for Elders and Deacons were held under Birmingham/ Wolverhampton Zone and Leicestershire/Nottingham/Northampton Zone. A high attendance of leaders had a great opportunity to pray together in one accord, pouring their hearts to God with no prayer list according to the letter from our father Dr EH Guti and received life changing teachings and great move of the Holy Spirit witnessed. Great deliverance took place, many people poured out their hearts and received counselling. Both zones elected Zonal Organising Committees to administer the continuity of their future meetings, seminars, prayers and planning of activities.

BELIEVERS PRAYER CONVENTIONS:

All regions held conventions. There was more of prayer and teachings, which revived, recharged and refreshed the church. Deliverance and healing took place across the province.

DELIVERANCE AND HEALING

The speakers were mightily used by God and the messages life-changing. The Parents Teachers Association (PTA) did a sterling job planning and running the conference with no area of lack. A total of 20 children received Christ as their personal saviour and all ministered to the speakers with gifts. Birmingham Region held a parents awareness conference in March. Children and parents were helped with eye opening teachings on what our children are exposed to in this nation. Leicestershire Region launched a 'Running to Win' course and the first session attended by officials from Braunstone Police Station and Leicester University which made it extra special.

YOUNG GENERATION: 53 children and 11 teachers attended its second annual conference at a purpose built Christian campsite. Teachings included salvation, practicing the Kingdom of God, right christian living and education in a global world. Many children were delivered from all kinds of spirits that included lesbianism and pornography. Over 20 children were baptised by the Holy Spirit and spoke in tongues on the Sunday. Glory be unto God.

YOUTH: Birmingham Region youth, the "Christ-Like Generation" hosted a concert in November. 400 people attended from all over the country and 16 young people got saved. They raised over £3,000.00. ploughed back into the Youth Ministry coffers and some to Missions. 4 youths who had left the ministry came back after the event. Their main activities target the Greater Birmingham Universities, the City Centre & outreach at Coventry University. The region have held many events such as worship nights, movie nights, fellowships, leader's workshops, leadership all night prayers and many other that aim at bringing more young people to Christ. They are a strong region and will continue to hold youth services such as all night prayers, business fellowships and outreach services. Wolverhampton Region Youth are Born Again Believers (BAB) and growing. They held their outreach concert in August themed "Arise and Shine". Leicester Youth are "Addicted to Jesus" and meeting regularly every month for fellowships, prayer and services. They hosted 2 worship nights attended by 100 people from all over the province. They are strong and increasing in number, had a prayer convention at the end of January and were revived by a wave of the Holy Spirit. God is faithful as the youth had continued meeting for prayer on Fridays even after the 10 days ended.





GIRLS FELLOWSHIP: They had their first provincial conference in October attended by 60 girls with mightily used speakers.

GO QUICKLY & TELL: 12 women attended Today's Woman in Zimbabwe and brought back life giving testimonies of how their lives were changed by the Word and prayer. More women were inspired to attend future conferences. 60 women attended a Big Saturday in March with a powerful speaker. 2 Big Tuesdays were held and we were privileged to have Pastor Carol Guti who encouraged us to stay in the word of God, to work with our hands as we work Home Talents. She also encouraged the ladies to continue praying for the Servant and Apostles of Jesus, Prof E.H. and Dr. Eunor Guti. The following Big Tuesday, Dr Mabel Samasuwo also taught about deeper intercession, specifically pertaining to praying for the Apostles Prof Ezekiel & Dr. Eunor Guti.

The ladies also went to Wales on a prayer retreat with powerful teachings, deliverance and counselling taking place throughout the retreat. A great move of the Holy Spirit was experienced on Sunday so much that some people were not laid hands on but they just bubbled in tongues, laughed in the spirit. We also had a powerful Business Empowerment session, where women were encouraged to start businesses. Many women were delivered from bitterness, unforgiveness, gossip, lying and many other spirits. Last year 80 women attended and this year the attendance was 150 women!! We give glory to God.

MEN OF INTEGRITY: The ministry has been vibrant with 36 men attending a prayer retreat in Wales. 

GO QUICKLY & TELL: We thank God for Overseer Mrs Vheremu's encouragement and teaching to the ladies, in all areas including home talents. The August prayer retreat in Wales had much deliverance and healing after teachings on opening businesses and working for our own families by speakers Overseer Greater Chikwawawa Pastor F. Simango. The ladies have managed to have several big Saturdays after being encouraged to pray for the work of God. Tuesday prayers continued in assemblies and regions.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Overseers W & E Mujuruki arrived on 11th October, under a great commission from the Apostle & Servant of God, Prof EH Guti to bring revival and we have seen a huge improvement and the impact they have made within the 3 months they have been in the province. Through obedience to God, they have introduced a series of strategic measures to bring that revival.

They have introduced Prophetic, Healing and Deliverance sessions held at regional level and a total of 13 have been held so far. Although the majority of these sessions were in Success Region, we take note of the one that took place in Glasgow Region, which was so powerful with a mighty presence and move of the Spirit that changed peoples' lives. The attendance at these sessions has steadily increased from 15 at the beginning to 44 on average and we have seen:-

People being healed from a lot of diseases and delivered from generational curses, bad dreams, sleepless nights and demonic attacks to mention but a few.

Many people who had stopped coming to church starting to come after hearing about the great acts of God that were taking place during these sessions.

The Overseers are empowering the leadership as they are training them on how to conduct deliverance sessions.

The Overseers have also visited the homes of many believers, praying for them and showing them the AGAPE love, which has uplifted believers in Scotland Province. These home visitations have been extended to backslidden believers who felt that love and are now coming to church which has resulted in increased church attendance. In particular, Edinburgh Assembly were they are based, church attendance has risen from an average of 35 to 75. Glory to God!

Leadership seminars have been held through regional worker's platforms, to empower leaders on good and effective leadership. They have taught on other topics that are important for the church, including the pillars of the church. Their focus on giving has resulted in more than 50% increase in tithes and all assemblies now have adequate funds to sustain them through free will offerings.

As we enter into 2016, they are already encouraging the church and Scotland Province has started working ZEGU talents and raised a lot of money. The level of zeal and enthusiasm is allowing us to believe that our province will excel in working God's talents.

HOME TALENTS: Many teachings by various speakers throughout the year encouraged many individuals to work hard for themselves, the majority of the big days being held at assembly level. The closing celebrations on 5th November appreciated many families and individuals for their achievements and obedience to the word of The Prophet with certificates of achievement. Celebration testimonies included buying of furniture, buying and building of houses in Africa, including a youth member who was building a house for her parents in Zimbabwe. The May Anniversary Celebrations were exciting as the church reached 55 years of age and the province revived once again remembering the things that have allowed the church to continue steadfastly to date.

- To encourage all ministries to be active
- To teach the word as written in the bible scriptures with the additional support from the books of the Servant and Apostle of God.
- To encourage all our leaders to attend UKMFCC bible school



SUMMARY OF STATISTICS: In 2015 our membership increased by 1.8% as a result of new converts and newborn babies. We have an increase in the leadership by 2 Elders and 1 Deacon who came in as transfers. A decline in youth numbers has been due to their enrolling to other parts of the country for university. Water baptism was a priority following the Europe Deeper Life conference teachings on salvation from the Servant & Apostle of God, Professor E.H. Guti.

DELIVERANCE SESSIONS: Evangelist Dr Gamuchirai Mutanda who was the guest speaker at our September PC and also visited East London and Essex and Southbank Regions to minister deliverance. Regions have reported deliverance sessions during the Easter Celebrations, Anniversary Celebrations, June Prayer Conventions and during the services we held with Evangelist Ezekiel Guti Junior and at prayer bands.

UK National Youth Big Sunday

The Sunday after the Europe Deeper Life Conference, the Youth had a Big Sunday with the Apostles Professor E. H. Guti and Dr. Eunor Guti, where all the Bishops, Overseers, Pastors and international delegates who were at the Deeperlife also attended. 700 Youth from all over the UK attended, including many visitors and young people from other churches, to hear the Word from the legendary Apostle Ezekiel Guti. Baba taught on self-control and the need to be delivered from pornography & other internet addictions. 12 Youths repented. Many gave their lives to Christ and some were in tears! Evangelist Dr. EJ ministered deliverance to over a hundred youths mainly in the area of destructive internet activity and bondage to electrical gadgets.

The International Youth Seminar:

A team of 5 UK delegates attended the seminar in Harare, led by the National Youth Director, Pastor E Tigere. A feedback strategy is currently being worked on which will greatly benefit the Youth from the treasure which was imparted at this great gathering.

National Youth Field Trips:

Field trips are being planned for all provinces, with a purpose to empower local structures in effective leadership. North West Provinces held theirs in September.

National Youth Leadership Seminar:

It was held in July in Birmingham and attended by 140 youth leaders. Teachings were extensively on leadership, the History of ZAOGA FIFMI, young people to love the church and the man of God. Other topics included were faithful tithing, careers development, giving, holiness and organisation, after which deliverance was ministered.

Youth Prayer Conventions

The youth continued fasting after the 10 days to the end of the month as they interceded for the Apostles who were ministering at the Pastors' Deeper Life Conference in Zimbabwe. They concluded with zonal prayer conventions, from 25th to 27th January 2013, where mighty deliverance was reported.

We want to see our young people mature in Christ and realise their call even in ministry.

Our young people are in need of mentors who will guide them in their Christian walk with a deep understanding of their church.

CHILD EVANGELISM

It is encouraging to note that the Child Evangelism (C.E.) ministry continues to function and grow, albeit slowly in all the regions and assemblies. Through our Director Pastor Phyllis Burke, almost all provinces now have functional Provincial and Regional Child Evangelism Committees. We thank God for a very small team of dedicated and hardworking individuals who are making sure that the ministry continues to be visible during all church activities. The National Child Evangelism Committee met and agreed that the current committee would continue with the work, but do more to build Provincial Committees to become more vibrant and active, filtering down to the Regional and Assembly committees. The following were also resolved: -

- All provinces to re-launch the Tin Mission Fund.
- Conduct provincial and regional training seminars for all teachers.
- Do more parents' awareness events across the country on Child Evangelism related issues to get the full support of parents and church leaders.
- Below are the summaries of provincial activities.

Midlands Province

The CE Board is in place and managed to organise a successful Young Generation conference in Wales attended by 53 children and 11 teachers. There was a mighty move of the Holy Ghost with a massive deliverence which lasted until midnight, many children delivered from all kinds of spirits including lesbianism and pornography. The speakers and Pastors were mightily used in ministering this deliverance to our children. Glory be unto God. Many issues that are troubling today's young generation children came out from the children during the question and asnswer session, including sexuality, sexual pervesions and pornography. A Holy Spirit session and baptism of over 20 children was conducted on the Sunday with many chidren receiving the gift of speaking in toungues. Glory be unto God.

Various regional activities are being done. 6 weeks Salvation and 6 weeks "Running to Win" programmes were held in Leicester, deep teachings on salvation and encouraging children to aim at achieving high grades (speakers included the local police, school teachers, local council official and university officials). A Parents Awareness event was held and well attended in Nottingham Region.

The other regions have functional committees and two have held events that specifically focused on CE.

North West Province

There is significant progress; the Provincial CE Board is functioning and very instrumental in establishing regional and assembly boards.
Children active on most Sundays at both the assembly and regional level. Some assemblies meeting with children on Saturdays for CE activities

Yorkshire Province

The CE Board is fully functional and have managed to establish assembly and regional structures.

The two regions with a total of 10 assemblies have a total of 127 children and 15 teachers.



South London Province

The CE Board is in place and active, with regional committees who are functioning though affected by lack of continuity due to unsuitable venues for accommodating CE services. The few dedicated teachers are doing the best they can to keep the ministry alive.

North London Province

The CE Board is in place and spearheading CE related activities; children meeting and being taught in assemblies, mostly on the junior and intermediate group levels. Some assemblies don't have teachers for the Young Generation group but they are being given opportunities to participate during Sunday church activities.

Though not at provincial level, the Young Generation had regional prayer bands and big Sundays which were well attended.

Scotland

There is no functional CE Board as yet but active regional committees; appropriate warm venues are their main challenge especially in the winter season.

Children are being taught, with two new teachers in Edinburgh and programmes being held almost every Sunday for 30 minutes.

One region had a Sunday specifically dedicated to CE and big improvements from parents supporting the ministry is being seen.

Conclusion

The CE Ministry is functioning, with notable significant improvements during the year though more still needs to be done. Provinces and regions are facing their main challenge of continuity, where CE activities still need to be made an integral part of every church activity and to have permanent slots on Sunday programmes. We are believing the God of our father that in this year of pulling down strongholds, our eyes will be opened to see and understand the importance of this ministry.

We continue to ask for your prayers that God may increase the very few existing teachers and for those enthusiastic few to be fully supported and encouraged as opposed to being led to drop off from being discouraged by some parents and church leaders.

We thank the God of our Father Dr E. H. Guti for this vision and continue to pray that true disciples of Ezekiel will emerge, who will prophesy, see visions and be mightily used of God (Joel 2:28). Our God is able.

GO QUICKLY & TELL

The Go Quickly Ministry continued to excel to greater heights just as our Father prophesied a different year in January that 2015. A sense of excitement and achievement within the ministry even as the National Office was furnished in 2014 and is up and running. This has been a benchmark that has brought a lot of joy and anticipation as we look forward to upcoming events and projects.

Intercession

We agreed as a nation to stand with our mother Apostle Eunor Guti in the special intercession programme for our Father which she mentioned at our Europe Deeper Life Conference. Regardless of our busy work schedules, the National Executive gave guidance on how this kind of prayer can be implemented. Provinces were allocated two weeks each and Midlands managed to cover the first two weeks of July. Intercession for the man of God and the work of God at large has grown to a greater magnitude as ladies do an absolute fast for 3 days and 3 nights. Other provinces like Midlands doubled their attendance from the previous year while North London actually did two prayer retreats in this same year. Ladies continued to meet for Tuesday prayers throughout the nation while in some provinces like South London, some ladies pray over the phone in the early hours each day. The spirit of prayer has no boundaries and is increasing as evidenced by prayer retreats in all the Provinces.

Events

Many activities took place as we hearkened to the word of the great Apostle of our time, Prof E.H. Guti at the Pastors' Deeper Life Conference, that 2015 is a different year and the church would grow thick through teaching. We have therefore engaged in teaching the ladies diverse subjects and expect to see growth just as was prophesied by the man of God.

Yorkshire Province had a modelling night which attracted a high attendance. A "Young Mothers Event" followed, where specific teachings were given then a pampering weekend event where ladies enjoyed a refreshing spa experience with facials, massages, steam and sauna rooms, to mention but a few. At the end of it all the word was preached.

South London Province had a similar weekend break as well and are holding successful Ladies Tea meetings. The wave is indeed sweeping the nation; Midlands had an energizing Zuma dance class on one of their Provincial Big Saturdays. Such fellowships and events, which were presented in different styles excited the ladies. The nation benefited greatly from Pastor Carol's teachings which were enriching and touched on every aspect of a woman. All the meetings were fruitful and had good turnout

Go Quickly National Event

The Go Quickly National Board met once and have scheduled for a National Event which will bring together ladies from all over the Nation as it has been a while since it was last done. The momentum is building as quite a number of events have been lined up.



Today's Woman Conference

Over 20 women excluding Pastors attended Today's Woman Conference in Harare. The selling of the event entry tickets by every Province attracted a better response and many Elders attended. The nation was blessed through powerful feedback by those Female Pastors and Elders at the Female Leaders' Talents launch on 20th November.

Home Talents

This report will not be complete if we do not mention the game of the season. Through Home Talents Conferences and Big Days, the nation has birthed a lot of Lady Entrepreneurs. North West Province is particularly proud in this area as their set targets at Big Days were doubled or trebled. The vibe is real and the fruits are evident, that indeed we now have business ladies who did not only catch the vision of the moment but continue to run with it.

SINGLE WOMEN

Introduction

2015 was a remarkable year for the ministry, with great strides being made in most of the provinces, slowly but surely. It was all by the grace of the God of His Servant & Apostle Prof EH Guti, who gave him the vision for this ministry in September 1985, making it 30 years. Having National Umbrellas is surely having a positive impact on the ministry and it can only get better and better.

National Activities

A unique 2-day National Board Seminar was held in February at the National Centre, to equip the board members on leadership skills, together with the Umbrellas. Powerful teachings were delivered, from resource speakers that included Rev M Nyambo, the National Administrator and the National Umbrellas, Overseers B & N Chakanyuka. They delivered powerful teachings around the following topics:-

- Understanding the Vision of the Ministry
- Duties of Board Members
- Qualities of an Effective Leader

NATIONAL CENTRE

Opening Remarks

This report is on this year's progress and developments on the project to build the National Centre in Birmingham. We thank the God of our father for the progress made through the year 2015, particularly that construction work on the ground has actually started. Praise be to God for thus far He has brought us.

Building Committee

The Committee has several members within it but a small subcommittee was selected to oversee the planning and design stages of the project. This sub-committee has continued to be in place throughout 2015, dealing with matters as the construction phase has started. The Sub-committee is chaired by Elder G Tegede and the members are Elder M Masimbarasi, Deacon N Dhumisani, Mr B Mbirimi, Elder M Mandisodza, Elder R Bevan, and the National Administrator Rev M Nyambo.

Meetings

Several internal meetings were held during the year at the National Centre, with weekly or bi-weekly update teleconference calls on Tuesday evenings by the subcommittee. There have also been a number of meetings with the professional companies that have been engaged to design and construct the National Centre. These meetings are generally held on a monthly basis.

Project Delivery Strategy
We have divided the project up into a number of phases as follows:-

Phase 1 - Construction of Main Auditorium

- Demolition of existing structure
- Foundation Construction for main auditorium
- Drainage construction
- Steelwork, Wall cladding and roofing
- Floor Slab Construction
- At the end of Phase 1 the main auditorium will be weather proof but will not have the internal fittings and partitions.

Phase 2 - Partitioning & Services Fitting

- Internal brickwork and room partitioning
- Install Lighting, Heating & Ventilation
- Install plumbing
- Install Audio & Visual Equipment
- Complete other internal fittings & fixtures

Phase 3 - Local Church & Community Centre

- Strengthen & Refurbish existing structure
- Refurbish walls
- Install new roof sheets
- Floor slab
- Install heating, ventilation, lighting & plumbing

Phase 4 - Landscaping

- Complete hard standing slab in parking areas
- Paint parking bays
- External site finishing and other landscaping



Progress Update

Some of the progress that we made through the year has been as follows:-

- 1. December 2014 we obtained revised planning permission for the new design to keep an existing building for use as a local church and community centre.
- 2. March 2015 we had enough design drawings completed to enable us to invite tenders from building contractors to do the work.
- 3. March to April 2015 obtained quotations for the two options that we were considering, i.e. whether to refurbish the existing structure or to demolish it and re-build.
- 4. April 2015 we made the decision to demolish the existing structure and re-build. This was based on the quotations that we obtained which showed that it would be cheaper to re-build instead of refurbish.
- 5. May 2015 we started some preliminary work on site which was to remove some asbestos from site
- 6. June 2015 Appointed a Construction Management Company to oversee the construction phase.
- 7. June 2015 Purchased Site Fencing
- 8. June 2015 Demolition of Existing Structure started
- 9. July 2015 Demolish of the existing structure was completed
- 10. August 2015 Foundation Piles Completed
- 11. October 2015 Foundation ground beams completed.
- 12. December 2015 Drainage pipes installed and drainage tanks installed.
- 13. The Contract for the Steelwork construction has also been awarded.



Looking Ahead

The foundation work has now been completed and are looking forward to the following programme of works on site for Phase 1:

- January 2016 Steel Fabrication starts in the factory
- ▶ March 2016 Steelwork erection on site.
- May/June Installation of wall cladding and roofing
- July/August 2016 Completion of Phase 1.

Financial Update

As of 17th November 2015 the total expenditure to date was £779,034.00.

Forecast for completion of Phase 1 is £1,321,930.00

We have not yet obtained firm quotations for Phases 2, 3 and 4 but out estimate is that the total cost of the project will be around £3.1million excluding VAT.

Closing Remarks

We thank God for all the progress that has been made this year and are also thankful that He took us over the obstacles that were in the way. We request that you continue to pray for us to work on this project with wisdom that comes from God and that God may continue to reveal and lead us to companies and professionals that will work on this project with a true understanding of our requirements.

NATIONAL FINANCE REPORT

Financial Overview

We thank the God of our father Ezekiel, guidance and prayers from our father that enabled and strengthened the National Finance Board composed of Elder Michael Masimbarasi (Chairman), Elder Ronald Bevan (Deputy Chairman), Elder Mercy Masiye, Elder Memory Mandisodza (Finance Director) and Elder Gwen Kanyangu (National General Secretary) to plan and manage the finances of the Ministry in the United Kingdom.

The Board is happy to report that 2015 was a fruitful year. All our provinces and ministries were able to raise sufficient funds to enable them to operate without any financial difficulties though we still need prayers for our smaller provinces to be able to increase their tithing. Some changes were implemented following the audits by the tax office in 2014, and these have not had a negative effect on our finances and operations. We pray that as we work ZEGU Miracle Talents in 2016, our members will remain faithful in tithing.

2015 was also a year where the Lord did great things through His children. There was an increase of 17% on tithing despite the working of Home Talents, which is a sign of faithfulness in tithing made by the children of God.

International Projects - ZEGU& MBUYA DORCAS HOSPITAL CONTRIBUTIONS

We thank the God of our father Ezekiel that we were able to fulfil our obligation towards ZEGU and Mbuya Dorcas hospital, as requested by our International Headquarters.

Assets Management

The Board has revisited the issue of our assets management. The Chairman of the Board of Trustees, who is also head of the assets team within the National Finance Board, remains overall in charge. There is now a new team who will also include representatives from each province. A Pastor has been assigned to work with this team, who will offer pastoral cover on behalf of the National Executive.

The team are responsible for the management of all assets, namely mission houses and their contents, as well as church equipment within offices and assemblies. The team will make periodical visits to Mission Houses, assemblies and every other place where church assets are kept.

The construction of the National Centre started during the year.

Audits

We are continuing to comply with the laws of this nation, and are happy to report that our books of accounts have been audited and filed to the regulating bodies on time.

2016 Plans

We are taking on the process of conducting elections for Finance Committees in our 6 Provinces and 20 Regions. We are planning to train these new committees and support them in every way possible as they start their new terms.
