REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the period from incorporation to 31 March 2016. The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, Accounting and reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) effective 1 January 2015.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The church was constituted as an incorporated charitable organization on 22 May 2015 and with effect from 30 September 2015, assumed, by way of transfer, the assets and undertakings carried out by a charitable trust (registered number 1140846) also known as Ark Community Church Sutton Coldfield.

The objectives of the organisation are to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Evangelical Alliance statement of beliefs. The church may also fulfil such other purposes which are exclusively charitable and relate to the charitable work of the church.

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Trust's aims and objectives.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The church has continued to meet weekly for worship and fellowship throughout the period on a Sunday morning and has also continued to hold weekly house groups for prayer, bible study and fellowship. Regular attendance has increased and is now averaging over 40. Throughout the period the churches regular meetings were at Mere Green Chapel which had been refurbished for our use, the cost to which the church contributed. Following this move new outreach activities have been planned and established and some existing activities relocated into the Chapel. The church has joined the 'Place of Welcome' network as it offers a place where the local community can come and talk and be befriended. Several special events have taken place to build links between the church and the wider community and these have been well attended.

Outreach to youth in the community has continued with fellowship, and discipleship meetings taking place regularly. Our youth activities have continued throughout the period with the after -school drop-in continuing together with regular meetings and activities including attendance at Soul Survivor & Momentum. Children's activities have also commenced during the period and are now held on a regular basis.

The Stepping Stones projects aimed at helping adults with learning difficulties and which comprise two café's run for the public and weekly sessions on independent living skills and art and craft have continued to operate successfully.

The church has continued to support several mission partners both in this country and abroad. The church has also forged links with a church in Brasov, Romania and during the period undertook a mission to help support this church.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The church is a charitable incorporated organization incorporated on 22 May 2015. The Trustees who served during the period and since the period end are as follows;

Trustees meet at least four times a year and are responsible for overall governance of the organization and keep under review its policies and practices. The Trustees have the power to appoint and remove Trustees in accordance with the provisions in the constitution and they keep their skill requirements under review and provide induction procedures relevant to the individuals' knowledge and understanding.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial performance

All income of the church is given via voluntary donations from the congregation or from activities run. The underlining income (unrestricted income) was £35,555 for the six months with regular expenditure totalling £38,263. However, the church made exceptional donations totalling £45,000 to Mere Green Chapel (a registered charity) towards the refurbishment of premises the church now uses. £20,617 resulted from an appeal and the balance of £24,383 was granted from unrestricted funds. Overall there was a net expenditure on unrestricted funds of £16,280 after transfers which has been offset against reserves brought forward. In addition, there was net expenditure on restricted funds in respect of the building fund offset by net income from the Stepping Stones projects.

Reserves policy

The church took over on the transfer of engagements, reserves accumulated for the purposes of supporting a church pastor and towards the provision of church premises and use has been made of these reserves during the period. Further expenditure is anticipated on these and reserves are also needed to support ongoing running costs.

During the period the remaining balance of the designated reserves established of $\pm 7,500$ has been released to offset planned deficits resulting from the appointment of the full-time pastor.

Risk policy

The Trustees regularly review risks to which the church is exposed to, to ensure that our policies comply with current legislation. The Trustees do not feel there are any significant risks to the stability of the charity at this time.

TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are responsible for the preparation of the trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards.

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume the charity will continue in business.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS PERIOD ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

1 Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

(a) <u>Basis of preparation</u>

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015.

(b) <u>Income</u>

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item of income has been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

(c) <u>Expenditure</u>

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third part, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified as on charitable activities, costs of raising funds or other costs.

(d) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of the charity.

Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified to be solely used for a particular purpose.

(e) <u>Tangible fixed assets</u>

Individual fixed assets costing £500 or more are capitalised at cost and are depreciated over their estimated useful economic lives on a straight-line basis as follow; Equipment 3 years
