Calcutta Rescue Fund

Annual Report 2015-2016

Our income in 2015/16 was largely unchanged from the previous year. In aggregate we received £106,100 in both restricted and unrestricted funds. In total, during the course of the year, we remitted a total of £125,933 to Calcutta Rescue in unrestricted funds and a total of £17,735 in restricted funds. Our unrestricted funding was principally to support Calcutta Rescue's HIV work which we have been able to do for many years due to the very generous support of one long term supporter.

Our remittance of unrestricted funds was significantly higher than in previous year. This was principally due to a decision of the trustees to use a very generous legacy received in the previous financial year in order to help Calcutta Rescue realise their vision to acquire and operate a much needed new building to house the school in Kolkata.

Due to time constraints of the trustee group, there was no single high profile fundraising event organised during the course of the year so as it was a quiet year from that perspective although we continue to be delighted by the number of successful fundraising initiatives which were organised not by the trustees themselves but by the much wider group of both long term and recent supporters of Calcutta Rescue.

We remain extremely grateful for the continued generosity of our new and long standing supporters who enable us to continue to provide vital financial support to Calcutta Rescue.

It has been a challenging year for the leadership team of Calcutta Rescue not least as team contemplates its vision for the future and succession planning. Calcutta Rescue has continued to provide excellent and high quality medical and educational support to Kolkata's poorest. However, the precise nature of this support needs to continue to be responsive to steps taken by the Government of India to alter the nature and extent of its medical and educational offering as Calcutta Rescue seeks to help to fill the key, and frequently more costly, gaps in service provision that remain. Much of the trustees' time and attention this year has been taken up with providing support to the leadership team of Calcutta Rescue on these issues.

We have been delighted to welcome a number of additional individuals to the UK support group during the course of this year. Some are new faces, some have come to us having worked recently in Kolkata and others are former active supporters who have re-engaged with Calcutta Rescue. All are extremely welcome and we very much value their perspective, support and wisdom.

Several of our trustees made the trip to Kolkata during the course of the year (funded at their own expense as always) in order to visit Calcutta Rescue's portfolio of projects and for meetings with the Governing Council, management team and staff.

Links with the other Calcutta Rescue support groups continue to grow. We hosted a very successful and well attended International Meeting which took place in the Bristol in May 2015.

As in the past, our wonderful team has produced two excellent and high quality printed newsletters and a series of e-newsletters for our supporters and continue to seek to use our website and other forms of social media to seek to keep our existing supporters up-to-date with news of Calcutta Rescue's tireless work and outstanding achievements and to reach out to new supporters.

Finally, and as ever, my very sincere thanks to all volunteers, donors (both in terms of time, money and other valuable resources), supporters and friends of Calcutta Rescue Fund who have given so generously of their time, money and encouragement to enable us to continue in our mission to offer help and hope to the very poorest of Kolkata.
