Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

As central government continues to cut the amounts it gives to County and District Councils for local services the pressure for those authorities to withdraw from any services that they do not absolutely have to provide increases. This means that charities such as ours are having to look to their own resources and those of their Parish Councils to survive.

With this in mind we continue to be grateful to East Lindsey District Council for their work in carrying out regular grounds maintenance including grass cutting hedge and tree maintenance and inspection of play equipment at the Park. Unfortunately we are having to take on more of the burden of maintaining and replacing play equipment although the District Council did pay for the replacement and repair of some of the safety surfacing under the larger pieces of this equipment. Alford Town Council provided another generous annual grant towards the running expenses of the Park. We value our partnership with both Councils and are most grateful to them for their support.

Alford Garden Services have maintained the gardens for us for another year. They carried out extensive winter pruning and covered all the gardens with wood chippings which makes the routine garden work throughout this growing season much more manageable. The gardens continue to be an important element in the Park and we shall keep them as well stocked as we can with the limited resources we have.

Our bank balance, even though still healthy, continues to decline and with the decorating of the Park becoming an urgent necessity there will be another significant fall next year. We are grateful to the Alford Round Table for the donation received on the winding up of the local group. We shall continue to look for opportunities for grant aid to improve our facilities as and when these become available.
