There is neither chief executive officer nor any staff employed by the charity. The day to day affairs are undertaken by Mrs E Henry on behalf of the trustees.

All major decisions are taken collectively by the trustees.

The trustees are unpaid and details of any related party transactions are disclosed as applicable in the notes to the accounts.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Bnos Agudas Yisroel is constituted by a Trust Deed dated 18 December 2007 as amended 20 February 2008. It is a registered charity number 1123216 and was registered as a charity on 17 March 2008.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees would be in line with the Trust Deed and with the consent of the trustees. The criteria set for the suitable candidate would be someone who is sensitive to the needs and demands of the organisation.

There are no policies for the induction or training of new trustees.

Risk review

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Trust, and are satisfied that systems are in place to manage our exposure to the major risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the charity are:

(1) to advance Judaism in particular by promoting the observance of its faith and doctrines among Jewish girls;

(2) the advancement of Jewish education among Jewish girls;

(3) the provision of recreational facilities in the interest of social welfare and with a view to improving the conditions of life of Jewish girls in need of such facilities by virtue of their youth;

(4) the relief of poverty for persons in need within the Jewish community.

Public benefit

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular to its supplementary public benefit guidance on advancing education when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and setting grant making policy for the year.

Grant making policy

The charity is funded mainly by fees.

Grants over £1,000 made during the year to institutions are as detailed in the accounts.

The charity invites applications for funding through contacting local philanthropists to contribute towards projects that are appropriate for the charities objects.

The trustees wish to record their appreciation to all the above benefactors for their kind support of the activities of the charity.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity received £nil in donations during the year, £8,100 in grants receivable from the National Lottery, £1,163 in fees from outings and shows as well as \pounds 52,345 in fees from the summer camp.

The charity also had income receivable from investments amounting to $\pm 11,469$ as well as $\pm 1,542$ in bank interest receivable.

The charity paid out a total of $\pounds 17,761$ for shows and outings as well as $\pounds 59,812$ for the summer camp operated by the charity.

The shows, outings and camp are all in line with the objects of the charity.

Grants over £1,000 made during the year to institutions are as detailed in the accounts and amounted to \pounds 4,067. These grants are all in line with the objects of the charity.

The charity has low governance costs comprising professional fees. All only other costs are borne by the trustees.

There were no material fundraising costs during the year.

There was an overall net outgoing of resources for the year amounting to $\pounds 7,921$ as detailed on the Statement of Financial Activities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Investment performance

The investments of the charity have performed reasonably well in the year.

The trustees consider this acceptable when compared with returns available on deposits in any of the banking institutions. The investment returns have been consistent for a number of years and are not at the expense of any exposure of loan to value covenants that would put these investments at risk.

Reserves policy

The Unrestricted Fund represents the unrestricted funds arising from past operating results.

The Trustees are satisfied that the balance of the Fund is an acceptable level of reserves given the nature of revenue receipts against grants payable.

In considering the financial obligations of the charity, the trustees have resolved to maintain a minimum reserve, being the current assets of the charity.

The trustees have considered the market value of the investment property taking into account the loan to value of the properties as well as the nature and exposure of the syndicate properties. The trustees consider the holding value to be the market value.

The trustees are delighted to have made many valuable contributions to the community as a result of this income and hope to be able to do so for many years to come.

The trustees feel that the activity reflects the profile and standing within the local community. The impact for future years' expenditure is self evident and the trustees would like to record their appreciation for all the financial support received from benefactors during the course of the year.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets and investments measured at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015), and the requirements of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015), (SORP 2015).

Incoming resources

Donations are included in the period in which they are receivable, which is when the charity becomes entitled to the resource.

Investment income is accounted for in the period in which the charity is entitled to receipt.

Fees receivable represents fees receivable from shows, camp and outings.

Resources expended

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and is recognised when there is a legal or constructive obligation to pay for expenditure.

The trust is not registered for VAT and accordingly expenditure is shown gross of irrecoverable VAT.

Charitable activities are made up of outings, shows and directly associated costs of these shows and outings for girls paid out by the trustees in line with the trust deed.

Governance costs relate to sundry office costs and any legal and professional costs incurred in the period.

Fixed asset investment

Fixed asset investments, including investment property, are included at market value, where appropriate, at the balance sheet date. Any gain or loss on revaluation is taken to the SOFA. No depreciation is provided on these investments in accordance with FRSSE.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds held by the charity are funds that can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.
