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## **Introduction**

At this time each year I prepare our annual report of the charities work over the past twelve months

We have two active projects in Uganda: The Mokono Womens' Group which is entering its second phase having completed a full years training with some twenty young women. Of the group we are also sponsoring a 12year old rape victim with a child to continue her Education we are paying her school fees. The second group of twenty has been recruited and are undertaking dress making skills support by a young deaf and dumb mother with a baby boy born without an anus . She helps the co-ordinator with demonstrations in the art of cutting patterns , drawing and cutting on materials and helping the new girls with other domestic tasks. These girls are rape victims or teenage pregnancies and come from small village communities that are in desperate need of support. Youth Education sport is sending the Co-ordinator £100 per month to support the activities, a small amount but sufficient to supply the group with its basic needs.

The Second project is "The Back to Work Nursery" Ssekogo This Nursery has two worker and twenty five children . We offer support through goods from the container that are sold and the funds used to support and develop the staff training programme

During this year we sponsored a student that visited Zambia from Battersea . The shop continues to attract students seeking work experience at weekends and throughout this year we have had five different students staying for up to twelve weeks at a time. Next year we will have problems at the weekends as the older students move on to University.

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Accounting convention
