

## Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the 18th St. Albans Scout Group

I report on the accounts of the Group for the year ended 31st March 2016 which are set out on pages 2 to 4.

### Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Independent Examiner

As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts; you consider that the audit requirement of Section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act) does not apply.

It is my responsibility to state, on the basis of procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charities Commissioners under Section 43 (7)(b) of the Act, whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### Basis of Examiner's Statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records.

It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters.

The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

#### 1. Accounting Policies

a) Basis of preparation

These accounts have been drawn up on an accruals basis, which is consistent with the previous year.

b) Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting by Charities"

c) Depreciation

Provision for depreciation of fixed assets held for use by the charity is made at annual rates calculated to spread the cost (less anticipated residual disposal value) of each asset evenly over its expected useful life

### Trustees Annual Report for the year ended 31 March 2016

### MAJOR ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE YEAR

At the end of the year we had 154 young members, which was a significant fall from the previous year total of 174, a fall of 20 from last year. This was partly due to the uncertainty surrounding continuation of Tuesday beavers, as well as general timing of other joiners and leavers within the group.

Subscriptions increased for the first time since September 2009 from £40 to £45 per term in January 2016, resulting in one term for this year being at the new rate.

Total capitation paid to St Albans District Scouts was £6,160 compared with £6,686 in the previous year. The basis of calculation changed this year, with an increase in rate from £34.60 to £41. However, the charge only applies to young members, and now excludes leaders and assistants. On the whole the impact is a small increase in charge. The fall this year is therefore caused by the fall in registered young members from 174 to 154.

We recorded Gift Aid income of £4,133 during the year compared with £4,224 in the previous year. Gift aid claims are now stabilising following a phase reduction in relief from 25% to 20%, with the expectation that gift aid claims will be reasonably steady over the coming years, subject to maintaining a consistent coverage of gift aid forms received.

Donations in 2016 were £505, down from £633 in 2015. This mainly represents a donation from GlaxoSmithKline through Tyler scout group.

Expenditure on maintaining the scout hut fell in 2016, significantly down to £354 compared with £1,413 in the previous year, with no material maintenance required this year. Expenditure on equipment remained steady from £2,228 in 2015 to £2,274 in 2016.

The General Fund shows a surplus of £4,458 for the year compared with £4,303 in 2015. The Building Fund shows a deficit of £3,646 for the year, made up of the annual depreciation charge on the buildings of £3,292 plus cash expenditure of £354. Our reserves, measured by the balance on the General Fund at the year-end, increased to £29,725 from £29,267 after a transfer of £4,000 to the Buildings Fund. The transfer to the building fund remained the same as the previous year.

The Group is a trust established under its rules that are common to all Groups/Districts.

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation & Rules of the Scout Association.

The accounts have been drawn up on the accruals basis that is consistent with the previous year.
