The Charity was registered with the Charity Commission on 9 January 2012, with registered charity number 1145330.

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers or duties.

The Charity's membership was unchanged during the period. Its members include some of the current trustees, as well as individuals who assist with the work of the Charity on a voluntary basis.

A group of more than 100 influential cultural and political leaders and parents have joined the Committee of Supporters for Hafs Academy Trust to support the cause morally and financially.

Objectives, activities, achievements and performance

Mission Statement

Day Time Academy

We are running this project with great enthusiasm and have received a very good response. Currently we have 163 students enrolled in Key stages 2 and 3 over two sites.

Adult Classes

We are running adult classes over three days a week to educate adults about all aspect of their life and the importance and involvement of religion in their day to day life.

Homework support sessions

We run homework support sessions for children within the community who need extra support within the National curriculum subjects.

What we do

Hafs Academy is an Ofsted registered secondary school (Ofsted number 316/6002). It provides full National curriculum subjects including Maths, Science and English. In addition, Hafs Academy aspires to become a well-established Community Centre for the whole of London, in particular, London borough of Newham. Hafs Academy provides a variety of activities and educational courses for adults, teenagers and children. Some of these initiatives fall under key themes - disability, education and learning, health and well-being, involving young people/parents and play.

The list of courses and activities provided shall increase as time progresses taking into account which courses or activities are most relevant and needed for the wider public. There are a variety of activities which take place at Hafs Academy, some of which are, group outings, sight observing, sports and fun days. We hope to benefit the wider community by giving parents, children, friends and family a Community Centre which is united, ambitious and progressive. We hope the community will support our aim to excel in the field of educational development and improvement by which our Centre will be a place of learning and bonding for the wider community. We also hope our Centre will be a place of encouragement in promoting physical fitness and psychological well-being as these have now become a great concern and are very important for the contentment of each and every individual.

Accounting and Reporting by Charities - Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015) and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006.

Fund Accounting

The General Fund is unrestricted and available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objects of the Charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds that are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors, which have been raised by the Charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. Statutory grants which are given as contributions towards the Charity's core services are treated as unrestricted.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the Charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Income tax recoverable in relation to investment income or Gift Aid donations is recognised at the time the relevant income in receivable.

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for gross and when incurred.
