TRUSTEES REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2016

The Trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 30 June 2016.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

Structure, governance and management

The Charity was established by a Trust Deed dated 17 May 1976 and is registered with the Charity Commissioners.

The Trustees who served during the year were: Mr A Rangoonwala Mrs S Rangoonwala Mr N K S Askari Mrs M Rangoonwala

The statutory power to appoint trustees shall be vested in the said Asif Mohamed Aly Rangoonwala (hereinafter the appointor) during his lifetime and thereafter by such successor individual as he may appoint by notice in writing to the trustees. Following the death of the appointor and any successor appointor the power shall be vested in the trustees.

The settlor of the charity was M A Rangoonwala (deceased).

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects are to provide financial support for purposes regarded as exclusively charitable under the law of England and Wales including the relief of hardship, the relief of the elderly, the advancement of education and the arts, and other charitable purposes for the benefit of the community.

The Trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

The Charity secured a donation during the year of £510,000 (2015: £525,000) from the Rangoonwala Foundation and made donations and grants of £529,904 (2015: £453,027) primarily to other charities which were identified as meeting the Charity's qualifying criteria. For the year under review the Charity focused on those charities which were active in education and community and as a result the Charity has continued to achieve it's charitable objectives.

Financial review

It is the policy of the Charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level which support the future activities of the charity and they are currently sufficient to meet the requirements of the charity for the foreseeable future.
