Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New Trustees are actively sought and encouraged to join the Board and the organisation is eager to recruit new trustees with relevant skills.

The Board will be undertaking a skills audit as part of the business planning for the future of Salcare.

#### **Risk management**

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. A risk register is held and operates under a traffic light system and is regularly reviewed by the senior managers with the Trustees.

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### **Objectives and aims**

To provide support for those in need in the community for those who are in need and experiencing poverty, unemployment, hardship and domestic abuse.

We collect donated furniture, household items, and clothes that we sell or give to the community, people referred to us from social care, multi-agency teams, health care teams, other voluntary organisations, charities and refuges.

We provide drop in for welfare benefits advice and domestic abuse, a community kitchen and laundry service.

We support people to volunteer with us and arrange for them to access training and development, we have placements from the University of Derby law school.

Due regard has been given been given by the Trustees in respect of guidance given by the Charities Commission on public benefit in deciding the above objects and activities the charity undertakes.

## ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### **Charitable activities**

ł

Salcare continues to be supported by a local food distributor '3663', local supermarkets and we are now members of 'Fare share' who also supply food to us for our food bank, which continues to grow - we provided 600 food parcels to over 1000 men, women and children between January and June 2016.

We have seen an increase in single men seeking support from Salcare.

Our specialist Domestic Abuse support service 'Escape' has support over 500 families over 12 months and continues to work in partnership with other organisations.

Our community Kitchen has developed a strong place in the community and has become a meeting place especially for the elderly who are living alone and for families who use the centre for clothing, furniture and food.

#### Staff and Board Members

The staff held a 'vision day' in February to develop an action plan to face the challenges that we knew we would face around funding.

During the year there were resignations from the board and new additions however we remain quorate at each meeting.

David Howe took over as chair as Lyn Allison resigned in 2015.

#### **Collections and Deliveries**

Both collections and deliveries were maintained over the year and continue to grow.

Public donations have sustained our furniture sales, however we need to develop this part of our business to maintain sales.

## **Community Development**

We have worked with other organisations, attended local authority meetings:

- Amber Valley Health Partnership
- Amber Valley Homelessness forum
- Amber Valley and Brewash Domestic Violence and sexual violence action group
- Social care team meetings
- Multi-agency tcam meetings
- Training around domestic abuse and domestic abuse and mental health
- Workshops and lectures at the University of Derby

## Funding, Promotion and Service development

We have maintained our funding and continue to look for means to sustain the organisation, and submitted a funding application to Big Lottery to continue the work of Escape.

# Financial review and reserves policy

A surplus of £32,328 was achieved in the year ended 31 March 2016.

We continue to maintain our cash reserves - with our fixed costs being covered for approximately 6 months.

The Board undertakes to hold at least two months' running costs in reserve, to be held in a separate account from the main current account.

## Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Heanor Parish Church Salcare

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2016 set out on pages five to eleven.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees (who are also the directors for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. #### Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statements below.

## Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2016

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

#### **Resources** expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Land and buildings	- 2% on cost
Plant and machinery etc	- 25% on reducing balance

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
