Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Charity for Kids objectives are to promote and further the care and relief of children age of 16 and under who have a terminal illness or who are suffering from a life threatening medical condition and in particular by granting feasible wishes of such children.

To also relieve the needs of children with a severe disability or impairment or any disability that immobilises a child by providing such facilities, equipment and services that are over and above those which the local authorities provide.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives.

Charity for Kids was set up by Paul Harris, Paul was stuck in a rut of drinking, smoking along with a poor diet, to get fit Paul entered the Hastings Half Marathon & decided to raise funds to make a difference to the lives of poorly children throughout the local community.

Volunteers

Charity for Kids continues to have 11 regular volunteers and actively encourage new members to join throughout fund raising events, our social media pages i.e. Facebook, Twitter and via our own website. We continue to encourage new members through our regular correspondence letters which go out to local businesses and supporters.

None of the volunteers or trustees receive a salary.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2016

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

In the past 12 months Charity for kids have helped 30 children, to date we have funded a specialist massaging clearance vest for a little girl suffering from Cystic Fibrosis, landscaped 3 families gardens including a young girl with autism and made the family garden safe, a little girl suffering with Cerebral Palsy & central sleep apnea, the family had no use of the area, so with the help of the Hastings fire brigade the little girl & sibling are now able to spend time playing together, the final family had a child with serve Autism and no understanding of danger also had there garden made safe.

Three children with Cerebral Palsy had body posture scoliosis suits and another child with Cerebral Palsy, had 12 sessions of speech and language therapy.

The charity have provided specialist tray for seating, two specialist wheelchairs for children with Cerebral Palsy and Spina Binidus Hydrocephalus, another young boy with Cerebral Palsy had a specialist mattress.

The Charity purchased a Lap top for a little boy suffering from Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease (CMT), we have also funded 6 different children with I-pads & communications aid software allowing them to now interact with family & friends.

We have funded twins with a table top fridge to store medicine, a p-pod Chair (Shaped to fit a child & keep there body/head/neck up right to stop suffocation, along with a Tricycle for each child.

There has been some interactive flooring installed for a child who has severe brain damage, the charity helped towards this, it also helped with a sensory area.

We have also provided further trikes and bikes and a wheel chair base for a young boy with Cerebral Palsy.

A child with a rare chromosome disorder had her garden and fence done for security and safety for her and a little girl with digestive problems had a specialist food and tube system to be peg fed at home.

We have funded a specialist breast pump for a mother & baby to produce the babies milk, unfortunately the baby recently passed away, the pump has gone to the Conquest Hospital to be used on the wards to help other young Babies, we also funded another child a specialist commercial food processor, this ensured the child was able to eat & digest all meals, up until this point the family were concerned that there child was going to pass away.

Charity for Kids have most recently purchased a piece of play equipment in Alexandra Park for both disabled and able bodied children.

We continue to fund the Respite Caravan ground rent, gas/electric/TV license etc.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be used to assist in the running of the everyday activities, whilst those that have been designated or restricted by the donors are held for the purposes they are intended for.

Principal funding sources

The principal source of funding for the year has come from donations and fundraising activities totalling £80,048.

FINANCIAL POSITION

At the year end the general reserves held totalled £81,506. Throughout the year £79,284 was generated from donations and fundraising activities. Resources expended totalled £67,818, which was primarily made up from £26,193 of costs of generating voluntary income along with £38,568 for gifts and donations made by the charity.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
