REPORT OF THE TRUSTEE BOARD

The Trustee Board presents its report and financial statements for the year ended 30th June 2016.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Constitution

MiD Mediation and Counselling Ltd. is a company limited by guarantee (company No. 03785436) and is a Registered Charity (No. 1076166). The company was incorporated on 9th June 1999 and on 1st July 1999 took over all the undertakings, assets and liabilities of MiD Mediation and Counselling (Richmond and District) an unincorporated registered charity (No. 289271). The activities of MiD Mediation and Counselling are governed by the original Trust Deed of MiD Mediation and Counselling (Richmond and District) dated 20th February 1984.

Method of appointment or election of Trustees

New Trustees are elected by existing Trustees on the board. Trustees' posts are advertised in the local, national and voluntary newspapers and on websites. Trustees are invited for a probationary period then appointed by the Board of Trustees.

Policies adopted for the induction and training of Trustees

Trustees are offered training and development through other voluntary networks.

Organisational structure and decision making

The Charity is organized so that the Trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. The day to day management is delegated to the Director and staff of Mid Mediation and Counselling Ltd.

Risk Management

The Trustees identify and review major risks that the Charity faces on a regular basis and have also examined other operational and business issues. Systems have been established to militate against significant risk.

CHARITABLE OBJECTIVES

The object of the Charity is to provide assistance through mediation for couples whose relationships appear to be breaking down and help in settlement of differences over associated matters, with particular attention given to the needs of any children. In support of these aims, the Charity also provides assistance to family members in need through adult and child counselling and mediation where children have become homeless through family breakdown.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Review of the Company's Activities

During the year ended 30th June 2016 the Charity successfully continued to provide mediation services to families and counselling to adults and children in line with its objectives.

Income for the year ended 30th June 2016 exceeded expenditure by £5,139, which was slightly ahead of budget. The small reduction in income was matched by careful control of all costs and this continues to be closely managed. We anticipate that next year will be tough financially, but plans are in place and we have agreed a break-even budget.

The bright airy new premises continue to be a positive factor and we value the addition of the garden area.

We continue to develop mediation good practice and to reach out to schools and other relevant groups to let them know about our child and adult counselling and family communication work.

We have updated our website to make it more user friendly and responsive, and updated all our marketing materials, creating new mediation leaflets for wider distribution.

After many years of involvement and service the Trustees are very grateful for the significant contribution of Michael Clein who stepped down as a Trustee and Anne Mawer who retired as Executive Director. We welcomed Ann Flintham as a Trustee and Lucy Bassnett-McGuire as Executive Director.

Financial policies

The Charity currently operates the following policies set by the Trustees:

- income reserves are intended to be maintained at a minimum of 3 months income and a maximum of 6 months
- all reserve funds are currently held as cash on deposit with a Bank or Building Society
- the Charity makes no grants to other organisations, but it may waive or reduce fees to clients of the charity, based on their ability to pay

Trustee Board Members

The Members of the Trustee Board listed above are also Trustees of the company under the terms of the Companies Act 2006. Appointments of new Trustees are made by existing Trustees at a Trustees' Meeting. There shall be a minimum of eight Trustees and a maximum of fifteen. During the year, the Trustees were:

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 30th June 2016

1. LIABILITY OF MEMBERS

The Company is Limited by Guarantee and has no Share Capital.

The Memorandum and Articles of Association provide that every member is liable to contribute a sum not exceeding £1 in the event of the Company being wound up while they are a member or within one year of ceasing to be a member. At the year end there were 9 members.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and to comply with the Companies Act 2006 and also the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) for charities - "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published by the Charity Commission in March 2005.

Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Equipment - Unrestricted funds 25% on reducing balance

Equipment - Restricted funds 100% on cost

Income

Income represents the amount receivable during the year, except for Income received by way of donations and tax refunds which are recorded in the accounts when received.

Direct Charitable Expenditure

Direct charitable expenditure includes all expenditure directly related to the objects of the charity. This includes support costs, which are the staffing and associated costs of supporting, monitoring and evaluating the work of the charity.

Other expenditure

Other expenditure is analysed under the Governance sub-heading and represents expenditure incurred in the management of the charity's assets, organisational administration, and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Fund Accounting

General unrestricted funds consist of funds which the charity may use for its purposes at its discretion. The charity's restricted funds are those where the donor has imposed a specific use on the use of the funds.

3. RESERVES

The charity's reserve policy is kept regularly under review. The policy is based upon a risk assessment of each source of income compared to the anticipated costs of the charity so as to maintain sufficient readily realisable reserves to cover future costs and commitments as well as to permit development of the charity's services.

4. RELATED PARTIES

No payments were made to the Trustees during the year.
