BRENTWOOD BAPTIST CHURCH REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER 2016

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year.

Objects of the Church

The Church operates under its own Constitution as approved by members. The Church is a member of the Baptist Union of Great Britain and Eastern Baptist Association.

The principal purpose of the Church is the advancement of the Christian faith according to the principles of the Baptist denomination. The Church may also advance education and carry out other charitable purposes in the United Kingdom and/or other parts of the world.

Organisational Structure

The Church is administered by the Managing Trustees which, during 2016, were the Minister and Deacons who are elected by the Church membership in accordance with the Church Constitution.

Review of Activities

Central to the work and witness of the Church is the provision of regular public services of Christian worship. In 2016 these took place at 10.30 on Sunday mornings and once a month on Sunday afternoons and at other times. There is a full children's programme during the 10.30am service for ages 0-14 years which runs concurrently with the morning service.

The Church building is also used on a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday by Kingfishers Pre School which, although linked to the Church, has its own charity status and separate accounts.

The Church has also maintained its support for missionary work both at home and abroad.

During 2015 the church appointed a Children's and Youth worker to organise and support the church's Sunday activities and midweek clubs for these age groups. This included not only those whose families are involved with the church but also those in the local area. This appointment has been very successful with numbers on the role for 'Connect', our open Youth Group for ages between 5 and 11, increasing to

35 with a regular attendance of about 20. A successful summer 'Holiday Bible Club' was also run for four days this year with 32 local children between the ages of 5 and



11attending. Our Children's and Youth worker also supports our neighbourhood Primary and Senior

schools, helping with lunch time clubs, assemblies and also the mentoring of children.





The church has for the first time in a few years run an Alpha Course. Alpha is a series of sessions, held over a meal, exploring the basics of the Christian faith. It is for those who want to know more about Christianity, for new Christians, and also for older Christians wanting a 'refresher' course about the faith. There were seven participants on the course which ran between September and December.



Another new initiative which started this year is 'Open Café'. This is aimed at the 20 to 30's age range and the church is set up in an informal café style. It is run on a Friday evening and has attracted increasing numbers with a regular attendance of between 14 and 26. (43 different people have attended at different times).

The church has continued its involvement with the local community through taking a major part in events such as 'Lighting Up Brentwood', a council run event as well as the 'Walk of Witness' and 'On the Move'. At Christmas we also organised carol singing, with free coffee and mince pies for our neighbours in Railway Square. The church has been pleased to see our facilities being used by the local community for a wide range of activities. The Trustees



have had regard to the Charity Commission's Public Benefit guidance published in December 2008.

The Leadership Team continues to seek to fulfil their responsibilities and the Minister remains very grateful to all involved in the fellowship for the different ways in which they assist the Church in fulfilling its calling.

Financial Review of General Fund and Communion Fund

Regular giving was again slightly down (2%) with a total for the year (both funds) of £80,682 compared with £82,598 for 2015. Receipts from contributions towards church expenses have continued to increase being £1,364 more than in 2015 which itself was significantly more than the previous year. The use of our facilities by Kingfishers Pre-school and by local community clubs contributes the majority of this income.

Total payments for the year (both funds) were £128,878 significantly more than the previous year (£113,779). This is largely as a result of significant repairs, redecoration and renovation of the church building, which were delayed in previous years while redevelopment was being considered. These renovations, the leadership believes, will put the church in a good position to meet the future needs of those using the church facilities, both members and the general community.

Payments were in excess of receipts in 2016 by £21,744 (both funds combined), compared with a budget excess of payments over receipts of £12,575. This can be accounted for by the reduction in regular giving (£4,818 below budget) and increased expenditure (£4,903 above budget). The increase in expenditure is largely due to increased spending on the church building (£4,871 above budget).

The Trustees of the Church meet monthly, at which time reports of the financial position are considered. A report is also considered on a bi-monthly basis at the Church Members' meeting.

Reserves Policy

In line with Charity Commission and Baptist Union guidelines the reserve policy is to allow funds to be available for two different possible situations:-

- a) To quickly meet an emergency unexpected or significant expenditure.
- b) To cover an unexpected significant short fall in income.

In either case the trustees believe the church should have sufficient reserves to be able to meet its obligations and continue to operate.

The Trustees consider that, as a minimum, the cash balances held in the General Fund should be £30,000. This has been achieved this year.

This amount is being reconsidered for 2017, particularly with regard to our commitment to the BU pension fund.

The Baptist Union (BU) is currently preparing to provide the church with an indication of the theoretical level of debt that would be applied to the church **if** we withdraw from the Pension Scheme. They anticipate the figure being available by the end of March 2017.

The Leadership has no current plans to withdraw from the Baptist Pension Scheme and therefore the theoretical level of debt will be for guidance only.

BMS Birthday Scheme

The total collected during 2016 was £1,271.00

A number of church organisations hold relatively small amounts of cash, held with their own records, for refreshments, craft materials and small birthday gifts etc.

At the end of 2016 the total amount for all groups was less than £1,500 (less than 2% of the church receipts).

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

- **1. Basis of the accounts:** These accounts have been prepared on a 'receipts and payments' basis in accordance with section 133 of the Charities Act 2011.
- **2. Income / Church Expenses contribution** The main contributor is Kingfishers Preschool for the use of the church facilities. However, a significant percentage of this income is from hiring the church facilities for events or to regular users such as Dance Space Essex.
- **3. Payments / Ministry & Mission** Minister, Administrator and Children's / Youth worker salaries.
- **4. Payments / Donations** Every year the church gives away in Donations at least 10% of its regular giving figure. In 2016 this was set at £10,200 to reflect the churches income from regular giving, Tax refunds and interest. Gifts were made to the following:-
