our care and for those needing saving. The day to day work load is mostly shoulder by the founder of the charity Diana Brusi and Hilary Delaney. Both work hard at ensuring communications with the perrera's and kennels are maintained and the dogs are safely evacuated from danger quickly and carefully. Diana negotiates the veterinary treatment both in Europe and in the UK together with ensuring transport is organised and all the necessary documentation that goes along side this. Hilary is the UK kennel coordinator who organises safe housing for dogs before being transferred to foster homes or adoptive homes.

All our volunteers work extremely hard to help the dogs both already in

The secretarial work is carried out by Jennifer Moseley who ensures minutes are recorded of the committee meetings held monthly. Petlog updates are done registering the dog to Terrier SOS once the dogs have arrived in the UK and updated again once the dog has settled into its new permanent home. Terrier SOS information is also kept on file by Petlog as backup. Correspondence to donators, fosterers and adoptive families is also prepared and sent by Jennifer.

The accounts are prepared for the charities accountant (Paul and Maundrel, Helston) to collate and submit on the charities behalf by Marie the treasurer. Our supporters are generous and all funds raised are spent solely on the care of the terriers rescued by Terrier SOS. There are no paid employees and all expenditure is used directly to cover the costs incurred in the rescuing, caring for and rehoming of the terrier dogs saved.

Terrier SOS dogs Milou, Candy, Fozzy, Louis, Dylan and Bella each with their own very special story, such sad and tragic circumstances bought them to us. We are very thankful for the love and care given in their forever homes. They will never be forgotten.

Our amazing supporters have ran, walked, sewn, crafted, raffled, held coffee mornings and even a bake off to raise funds for us. We have held fun auctions where kind donations are won and the amazing treasure and borlee hunt which entertained us and far exceeded anyone's expectations.

We are so very grateful to our fosterers who make such a difference and to our home checkers and to those that help with transport. We cannot thank any of you enough for the donations and help we receive, we are truly grateful. We see these desperate dogs in need and because of your help we have been able to help save and change their lives.
