The events that we have attended have also been opportunities to educate the public about animal welfare, the need to challenge animal cruelty, and how animals are best cared for.

Animal Canopy promotes animal welfare in the main by making grants to appropriate organisations who have met the grant making policy requirements. Each organisation has followed the application process prior to the grant being released, and has then executed the project/activities which provided the basis for the grant being made.

## Section D

## Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Achievements in 2016.

Our activities in 2016 have primarily been in 2 areas – fund raising and welfare of the dogs of the homeless people of the Bournemouth area.

Our fund raising activities have included street and shop collections, attendance at school and local community fairs/carnivals/fetes/craft fairs etc, table top sales, celebration evenings and a number of financial donations. We have also been well supported by the donation of items for our events (including individually crafted items, unwanted presents and other items which supporters have wanted to give). During the year we have attended 52 events. They have all been based in Dorset and Hampshire.

We support the dogs of the homeless people of Bournemouth by providing supplementary nutrition, veterinary clinics at a hostel for the homeless, veterinary care (regular vaccinations, micro-chipping, neutering, medical care as needed), and equipment (e.g. dog coats, etc). We have been generously supported in these activities by one of the local veterinary practices — Natterjacks of Pokesdown Bournemouth, for which we are very grateful.

A total of £12359 was raised in 2016, which was an increase of about 20% on 2015. This reflects the hard work and commitment shown by the trustees and supporters.

We evaluate grant applications twice a year (February and August), and as a result have made grants of £7510 in 2016. Of this total, £4250 was to UK based organisations and the rest went to overseas organisations. It has been very encouraging to hear how the organisations have used the grants to further animal welfare and provide public benefit in doing do. We also spent just over £2720 on the dogs of the homeless people in Bournemouth. This is a significant increase on 2015, reflecting the increased need for supporting these dogs (and their owners).

We have appointed Anton Stephans (finalist in the X Factor TV show) as our patron. He performed a concert for us in November, which was very well received.

The trustees have had due regard to the guidance on public benefit given in the Charities Act and the Charities (Accounts and Reports)
Regulations 2008 when planning and executing each event.

Plans for 2017.

We plan to consolidate our ongoing activities, and add to them as opportunities arise. We expect to work closely with the organisations that we support. We aim to keep the charity at about its current size as this works well for all involved with it.
