In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention:

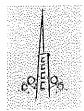

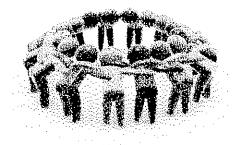

# Structure, governance and management

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

## **Objectives and activities**

St John's PCC has the responsibility of co-operating with the incumbent, in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has maintenance responsibilities for the Church, the Church Hall and 7A Upper St Michael's Grove.

# Achievements and Performance - Church attendance

(Numbers in brackets – 2016 figures)

There were 130 (124) parishioners on the Church Electoral Roll, of whom 69 (65) are not resident within the parish as at 31st December 2016.

The average weekly Church attendance in 2016 was 101 (106) adults and 12 (11) children (under 16) but this number increased at special services. Messy Church was held monthly during 2016, with the exception of January and August, on the first Sunday of the month, with an average congregation of 40 (38) adults and 30 (30) children. In the weeks before Christmas, local schools held their annual Carol Services in the church and Christingle services were held for the uniformed organisations.

# **REVIEW OF THE YEAR**



The PCC met seven times during the year with an average level of attendance of 17. Committees met between PCC meetings and their minutes were received by the full PCC and discussed where necessary. All PCC meetings received financial, Safeguarding and Health and Safety reports and Synod reports were given by the two representatives.

# January (17) (Numbers in brackets indicate attendance)

The new Safer Recruitment document issued by the Diocese was presented to PCC members. Following recent Leading Your Church Into Growth (LYCIG) sessions, the Vision & Plan for growth was adopted by the PCC. The PCC discussed, and agreed to support, a new prayer ministry between services on a Sunday to start in February. In financial matters, the PCC was informed that the Parish had been registered for the Parish Giving Scheme and also decided to offer financial support to help Whiteley Parish pay their Parish Share.

#### **March** (17)

An update was given on the progress of the transition to the Parish Giving Scheme and the amendments to the new Safer Recruitment policy (including accepting and approving a Safeguarding Policy update). Possible courses for 2016/2017, such as Christianity Explored, The Joy of the Gospel and Grace Notes, were discussed and PCC stated their support for these courses. Final 2015 accounts were discussed and approved by PCC, as was work to remedy water ingress issues. PCC also began to consider options for a new projection system at the front of church.

#### May (18)

Sue Lupton stood down as PCC Treasurer after many years of service and Janet Tucker was agreed as new treasurer and co-opted onto the PCC. Our Parish Safeguarding Policy Statement was shared with PCC members and signed by Bruce and the Churchwardens and the list of committees and committee members was reviewed following the APCM. PCC reviewed ideas coming from the LYCIG course, including the possibility of distributing prayer cards to homes in the parish. Bruce reported that an application for a curate had been made.

#### **July (18)**

PCC was presented with the quotes received for work to remedy the water ingress and also agreed to finance magnets to be distributed along with prayer cards in the parish. PCC discussed and agreed the percentage of parish income that would be tithed for 2016. Ian Cranstone stood down as PCC Secretary and Ken Patching stepped down from his role on PCC, members of the PCC joined Bruce in thanking them both. Vicky Duboc was agreed as new PCC Secretary. Bruce reported that our application for curate had not been successful at this time. PCC thanked the social committee for a successful community day in June.

## September (16)

The Vicar of Whiteley Parish (Philippa Mills) joined the beginning of this meeting in order to share an update on initiatives within her parish. PCC reviewed a 2017 budget consultation from the Diocese and received an update on the Parish Giving Scheme. PCC approved electrical work recommended in the 5-year inspection. A letter of thanks was received from Christians Together in Fareham for support of the Holiday Club week which took place in the summer and was very successful.

# **October – Extraordinary Meeting (18)**

An extraordinary meeting was called to discuss the church finances due to a foreseen end of year shortfall. PCC discussed and prayed about the situation and agreed on a number of actions including informing the church family and organising a parish giving day/month in November.

#### November (16)

Following on from previous discussions and the extraordinary meeting in October, PCC reviewed the current financial situation and expressed their gratitude to the church family for their generosity at the Gift Day. It was also agreed to introduce a heating fee for winter weddings/baptisms and a fee for the use of the church lounge for the diocesan 'Living Faith' course. PCC heard that the light party was well attended and a great success. Bruce informed PCC that Alan Ferrier had requested permission to officiate as a Reader in Portsmouth Diocese, PCC noted their support for this request. In his Vicar's Report, Bruce also updated PCC on his chaplaincy role at the college, including recent developments such as having a stand at the College Freshers' Day.
