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

REVIEW FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2016

As Chief Executive Officer I am pleased to present the Trustees' Annual Report together with the financial statements of Freedom Charity.

FREEDOM'S SUCCESS

Welcome to Freedom's report and end of year review for 2016

As you may have noticed we have a new logo and have rebranded our image. This is reflected in our newly designed website, which is easier to navigate and has more relevant information about our work which helps teachers and professionals.

This year has been very special as we have seen the publication of a new novel on Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) by Aneeta Prem. This is the first novel of its kind aimed at children and teenagers.

We have had funding from the Forced Marriage Unit for a couple of projects. The majority of this is to continue with our work on our education programme.

We received funding from the Department of Education for continuing our work on Forced Marriage in schools and colleges.



Over the year we have visited even more schools, colleges and universities and delivered training and assemblies to students, staff and professionals. We have donated thousands of copies of '*But It's Not Fair*' to schools and children throughout the UK.

Continuing from last year on the three areas of our work: communication, education and influencing:

COMMUNICATION PRINTED AND E-MEDIA

We have rebranded our logo and have been working on the website to make it easier to navigate and have sections for teachers, professionals and easier ways to donate online.



'Cut Flowers', a new novel on FGM was printed in June 2016.

We were honoured to have the actress Miriam Margolyes write a fantastic passionate Forward for the book. Miriam was kind enough to attend the launch at the House of Commons in the summer which was hosted by the Secretary of State for Education, Justine Greening. School children and teachers from around the country and donors were invited to the book launch. The Minister was supportive of the work we were planning to deliver on FGM. There was moving speech from an FGM survivor who shared her story and moved the audience to tears.



To work alongside the book in schools we partnered with the PSHE Association to ensure that our lesson plans on FGM were accredited.

We have updated all our other accredited lesson plans on Forced Marriage, so we now have great resources for schools to assist them to tackle sensitive topics.

We are still distributing our first novel *'But It's Not Fair'*, over 44,000 copies of which have been donated to schools and colleges.

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EDUCATION

When the PSHE Association announced the Freedom lesson plans for FGM on their mail shot to teachers we had over 150 requests from schools around the UK, not only for the lesson plans but also staff training and assemblies and talks. We know this is an area we can deliver successfully, going on from our achievements in Forced Marriage.

During this year we have performed a record number of visits to schools, colleges and universities nationally.

We have been invited back to some of the schools we visited last year, but the vast majority have been new school visits.

TRAINING PROFESSIONALS

In July and August 2016 we were invited to deliver training to key NHS staff i.e. GP's, midwives and staff nurses on Forced Marriage and FGM. These events were highly successful and the feedback from the staff was excellent. Most did not know the difference



between an arranged and Forced Marriage before the talks. They all felt they were more confident to know what the signs of Forced Marriage were and where they could go to report it.

Freedom has been involved with key conference organisers in the last year and we were invited to deliver talks by events run by the Capita Conference and Optima and the PSHE Association as Freedom is recognised as the leader in the field of Forced Marriage. Aneeta was

once again invited to Chair their conference on Forced Marriage this year. This has become an annual event with Freedom being consulted on who the guest speakers should be and the topics and format of the conference.

INFLUENCING

Freedom is continuing to work with the Home Office and Foreign Office and has been invited to comment on human rights abuses on national news channels throughout the year .

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LOOKING FORWARD

Following the successful launch of the second book '*Cut Flowers*', Aneeta has been approached to write a third novel on radicalisation and its prevention, which is affecting young people in schools, colleges and universities around the country to help prevent children and young people who are in danger of being radicalised in the UK. Work on the new novel is due to start in early 2017 and will hopefully be ready for print in the summer of 2017 and ready to distribute in autumn 2017.

We will work to ensure our lesson plans and teaching materials are accredited so teachers can be confident to use them in the classroom.
