### CELESTIAL CHURCH OF CHRIST HOREB OF GOD PARISH Trustees' Report

The Trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2016. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) and applicable law.

#### Structure, governance and management

Horeb Of God Parish Church is governed by an Approved Governing Document which states that the principal purpose of the church is the advancement of the Christian Faith according to the principles of the Worldwide Celestial Church Of Christ to include the advancement of education, community service and such other general charitable purposes in such parts of the United Kingdom and the world as the Church shall determine.

Horeb of God Parish is a rented Property and we are striving to buy a property that will help to maximize our charitable functions (training, educational and seminars).

Members of the Church are accepted in accordance with the Constitution which requires to be baptized after one Year

Members are encouraged to take an appropriate part in the spiritual and practical tasks involved in furtherance of the charitable objective.

Relevant matters may be submitted to the Church meeting by the Trustees for guidance, or may be raised by members in Church meeting for further consideration by the Trustee.

Though the Constitution permits decisions to be made at Church meetings by appropriate majorities, the Church seeks to work by consensus wherever possible.

In order to achieve the principal objective which is set out above, the Church provides a variety of activities both to its membership and to the community generally.

The aim is to show the love of Jesus Christ in both word and deed and to bring people into a closer relationship with Our Lord Jesus Christ as living Lord.

Central to the work and witness of the Church is the provision of regular public services of Christian worship. These services take place each Sunday 10:00am, Wednesday 7:00pm and Bible Class After Friday: 7:00pm

There are also occasional services at other times which are advertised on the Church Notice Board.

There is a full children's programme during the Sunday services.

The church seeks to be a friendly and welcoming community and anybody is free to attend any of these services and Seminars.

The 3rd Sundays of the Month is set aside for full Youth Participation in Sermon, Evangelical and Prophetic Services and Seminars.

The Church runs a series of house groups for the growth of faith and discipleship in the homes of some members, and further details of these can be obtained from the Trustees on request, or at the Sunday services of worship.

The Church operates systems to ensure that all people working with children and vulnerable adults are appropriately vetted with regard to the Criminal Records Bureau.

The church has read the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit, and is satisfied that the activities outlined above clearly demonstrate that the charity is providing a benefit to the public.

### **Achievements and Performance**

The Church does not measure the success of its programmes only in numbers, including financial numbers, but also in less tangible areas like fellowship and encouragement. The Trustees recognize that these are difficult to measure.

New Members joined and proclaimed faith in Jesus Christ for the first time during the year, and were baptized and received into church membership.

For this financial year, things have not worked out as much as we have envisaged much but that notwithstanding, as an organisation we have been able to remain steadfast in both the work of the ministry and support to the outside world.

This time we have devoted a lot of our resources both financially and materially to internal development of our members so as to be more proactive, not only in the church but equally in the community.

The need for this new development arises from the fact that the church today has a larger membership of the congregation within ages 12-21.

Not only are these groups vital to the church but are vital to the community as well because the future of any nation, home, church or organisation lies in this greater tomorrow (Youth).

In view of this fact the church embarked and carried out six week leadership training, even though expensive but was worth the effort.

There was also a separate youth programme in entrepreneurial lecture paid for by the church. Also through one of the trustees of the church, the youth and adult members of the church took part in career counselling and conference organised by the Reach Society UK.

You may wonder why the church has to invest on these activities, and the answer is that the church wants its members to be active, responsible members of the society at large.

On the charity level, we have been very supportive in contributing our widows might. to organisations both in the U.K. and Nigeria.

I do believe that we will continue to be able to do all these noble activities in years to come

The church was encouraged by remarks made by one of the Anchor House Canning Town about the positive part the church played in the life of the community of Canning Town, since in addition to activities formally linked to the church, members also served as

Volunteers in other local charities and organisations where we supply food and clothing work with families in need and even support indigent children in Lagos, Nigeria in schools with financing.

The Church continues to raise the funds which it needs to carry on its activities from within its own membership and congregation. No wider public appeal was made for funds during the year.

The significant expense related to the appointment of the Shepherd, to lead and co-ordinate the church's activities including the Wednesday, Friday and Sunday Services, to provide pastoral care for the congregation and other people, and to equip and encourage the members in their life, Christian witness and service.

The Church expressed its part in the life of the wider church by making grants to national and international Celestial Church Of Christ and societies with Christian aims and objectives compatible with the church's own charitable purpose.

The Church is heavily dependent on its membership working as volunteers in all aspects of the church's activities, many of which run with little or no impact on the church's expenditure, but nevertheless contribute substantially to the achievement of the church's objectives.

The financial results for the year, together with a summary of the accounting policies adopted are set out in the accompanying financial statements.

The Trustees have established a Reserves Policy, and are still struggling to have sufficient fund to run the Church, but with ongoing income anticipated, to enable the church to function effectively in the coming year.

The Trustees have made an assessment of the major risks facing the church, and are satisfied that there are policies in place to minimise these risks.

### 1. Accounting Policies 1.1) Accounting Convention

The Financial Statements has been prepared under the historical cost convention, in accordance with applicable UK Accounting Standards and also with the recommendations in the Statement of Recommended Accounting Practice (SORP 2005) Accounting and Reporting by Charities - issued in March 2005.

The Charity has taken advantage of the exemption of Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 from the requirements to produce a Cash Flow Statement on the ground that it qualifies as a small charity.

### 1.2) Fund Accounting

General unrestricted funds represent unrestricted income, which is expendable at the discretion of the Trustees in the furtherance of the objects of the charity

### 1.3) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalized and included at cost including any incidental cost

Depreciation is calculated on the fixed assets to write off the cost of the assets less their residual values, in equal instalments over their expected useful economic lives. The annual rate in use is 25% per annum.

### 1.4) Incoming Resources

Income is mainly from Tithes and Offering, Building funds. Gift Aid, grant and bank interest received are included in the financial statements when received.

### 1.5) Resources Expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accrual basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

### 1.6) Taxation

As a charity, the charitable funds are exempt from corporation tax but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is, in accordance with standard accounting practice, included in the cost of those items to which it relates.
