There is no chief executive officer employed in the charity. The day to day affairs are undertaken by Rabbi Y Sipper on behalf of the trustees.

All major decisions are taken collectively by the trustees and all the trustees give of their time freely.

The trustees are unpaid and details of any related party transactions are disclosed as applicable in the notes to the accounts.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Areivim is constituted under a trust deed dated 25 July 2008. It is a registered charity number 1125655.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees would be in line with the Trust Deed and with the consent of the trustees. The criteria set for the suitable candidate would be someone who is sensitive to the needs and demands of the organisation.

There are no policies for the induction or training of new trustees.

Risk review

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Trust, and are satisfied that systems are in place to manage our exposure to the major risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the charity are:

- 1) To act as a resource for young people living in Gateshead by providing advice and assistance and organising programmes of physical, educational and other activities as a means of:
 - a) Advancing in life and helping young people by developing their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as independent, mature and responsible individuals;
 - b) Advancing education and
 - c) Relieving unemployment.
- 2) To advance the education of children and young people in Gateshead by providing or assisting in the provision of education services, facilities, grants and bursaries.

Public benefit

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular to its supplementary public benefit guidance on advancing education when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities and setting grant making policy for the year.

Grant making policy

The charity is funded by donations. The charity gives out grants in line with the above objects.

There were no individual grants made during the year.

Grants made during the year to institutions are as detailed in the accounts. The application of the funds by way of grants to either institutions or individuals and is almost always to institutions.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The charity received £79,383 in donations during the year out of which £17,913 was paid out by way of teaching, other direct expenditure & support costs, £50 was paid out on grants and £50,690 was paid out for scholarships. This expenditure is in line with the stated objects of the charity.

The charity had low governance costs.

There were no investments made during the year.

There were no fund raising costs incurred during the year.

There was an overall net incoming of resources for the year amounting to £10,730.

Review of activities and achievements

The charity funded various educational projects in line with the trust deed and also paid out scholarships and bursaries in line with the objects of the charity.

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds at a level sufficient to cover unforeseen and major expenditure and shortfalls in income. The trustees remain confident of their ability to raise the necessary funds, thereby adhering to the stated policy and to the maintenance of a balanced budget.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES
