CITY OF LONDON CHOIR REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2016

The Trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 31st July 2016.

Constitution and Objects

The Charity's Governing Document is its Constitution which was last amended on 26 March 2003. The constitutional objects of the Charity are:

- To advance the musical education of the inhabitants of London by the study and practice of choral music; and
- To promote choral concerts, particularly in the City of London, for the purposes of fostering the public knowledge and appreciation of such music.

In pursuing such objects, the City of London Choir aims to provide exciting musical experiences for members and audiences. In particular, it seeks to:

- Encourage amateur singers, especially those based in the City, to develop their musical expertise and enjoy singing together;
- Provide increased opportunities for audiences to hear both established and less well-known works;
- Demonstrate that music of the highest quality can be achieved by amateurs and professionals working together;
- Celebrate and share the fun of music-making and to encourage more people to experience choral music, whatever their age, background or previous musical interest; and
- Support charities and worthy causes.

Development, Activities and Achievements

The City of London Choir is busy and versatile, regularly performing in ensembles from 8-12 singers to our full strength of around 120. We have provided music for a wide range of social and corporate events and we are particularly pleased to support events organised by our sponsors.

In our 2015-16 season, as a sole promoter we promoted three concerts during the year, rather than our normal four. In December we held two Carol Concerts; for the ninth time in St. John's, Smith Square, with Stephen Farr at the organ and Timothy End at the piano, and then at the Barbican Hall with Timothy End (piano), Jeremy Cole (organ) and the RPO Brass as accompanists. In March, at the Barbican Hall with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, we performed Brahms' *German Requiem* and *Psalm 98*, with soloists Claire Rutter (soprano) and Stephen Gadd (baritone). Claire also sang Strauss' *Four Last Songs*.

As a co-promoter with the RPO, we participated in the first two of our series of six joint Haydn/Mozart concerts at the Cadogan Hall. In November we performed Haydn's *Nelson Mass* and Mozart's *Regina Coeli*, with soloists Rachel Nicholls, Catherine Hopper, Jeremy Lloyd Roberts and Darren Jeffrey. Tom Poster performed Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 23. In April we performed Haydn's *Paukenmesse* and Mozart's *Laudate Dominum*, with soloists Grace Davidson, Anna Harvey, Mark Wilde and Ashley Riches. Leon McCawley performed Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 21.

As usual the choir also participated in several concerts promoted by other organisations. We were extremely pleased to be invited once again to perform at the English Music Festival held in May in Dorchester-upon-Thames, where we performed a selection of works by Elgar, Bliss, Sterndale Bennett, Havergal Brian, Howells and Dankworth, accompanied by the Holst Orchestra with Marta Fontanals-Simmons (CLC alumna) as soloist. In December we were again invited to sing at VSO's annual fundraising concert held, this year, in Methodist Central Hall which, as always, proved to be a popular event for both audience and members of the choir. We also continued our relationship with Raymond Gubbay Ltd, performing Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony* in September, the 'Classic Carols' concert in December, both at the Royal Albert Hall and finally in April at the Last Night of the Spring Proms at the Royal Festival Hall. In November we were invited by the London Mozart Players to perform Mozart's *Mass in C. Minor* and *Regina Coeli* at St. John's, Smith Square.

Promoting concerts at large venues such as the Brahms Requiem at the Barbican Hall in 2016 requires a significant level of outside support, and we are extremely grateful to all those individuals and organisations that have provided much needed support without which this season would not have been nearly as successful.

Finally, at the end of the season in July, the choir recorded a CD for RPO Records featuring Haydn's Nelson Mass and Paukenmesse with soloists Rachel Nicholls, Grace Davidson, Anna Harvey, Mark Wilde and Ashley Riches, accompanied by the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra under the direction of Hilary Davan Wetton. The CD was released in November 2016.

The Choir is a member of Making Music, previously the National Federation of Music Societies.

Reserves Policy

The Choir needs to hold reserves for a number of reasons: to provide a cushion against losses in the course of a year, to enable it to commit to expenditure up to a year ahead and to give it flexibility in its long term planning. The Choir's policy is to hold a level of reserves that is broadly equivalent to between one and one and a half year's worth of planned future expenditure.

New Charitable Incorporated Organisation

A new Charitable Incorporated Organisation (the new Charity) with Charities Reference Number 1164955 was registered with the Charities Commission on 21 December 2015 in the name of the City of London Choir. A full transfer of assets from the current Charity (Reference 265024) to the new Charity took place on 31 January 2017. The old Charity Reference has subsequently been removed from the Register of Charities.

Trustees' responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

We choose under the constitution of the Charity to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of its financial activities for the period. In preparing these financial statements we:

- make reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the City of London Choir

31 JULY 2016

1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Charities Act 2011.

Fund Accounting

The Charity's Unrestricted Funds consist of general funds which the Charity may use for its purposes at its discretion.

Restricted Funds are those where the donor has imposed restrictions on the use of the funds.

Income arising on restricted funds and expenditure incurred in respect of these funds are reflected through the Statement of Financial Activities with any surpluses or deficits being appropriated to/from restricted funds.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

2. Income
