Chairman's report

A year of change

The last year for the Charity was dominated by the decision by Shere Manor Estate to sell a significant part of the Hurtwood, some 800 acres. Friends of the Hurtwood has managed public access to the Hurtwood for many decades but despite repeated assurances from Shere Manor Estate the sale prompted fears that access to the land put up for sale might be restricted or even withdrawn. Access by the public was made possible by a Deed of Dedication made in the last century by the landowner, R. A. Bray and a condition of sale was that the Deed would pass intact to the new landowners. The sales were completed during the course of the year and consistent with the wish of Shere Manor Estate, each of the new owners invited Friends of the Hurtwood to continue to manage public access to the land now under their ownership. All that was required for us to continue our access management role was a Management Agreement with each new landowner and the last of these was agreed during the latter half of the year.

So for the Hurtwood visitor, aside from subtle changes in some signage, little will change. Some boundary markers have appeared but these are only for reasons of title – no barriers will be erected to delineate ownership! For the Friends of the Hurtwood, or more specifically our Ranger, the key change is that we now have eight landowners to liaise with instead of just three. In reality this should not present too much of an operational challenge as the contents of the Management Agreements are essentially identical.

A change to be put to members in a special proposal at the Annual Meeting is a revision to our governance structure to create a corporate trustee company. There is really nothing unusual in this as we are following in the footsteps of many other charities who have adopted this approach to mitigate risk. In simple terms, if agreed at the Annual Meeting, this will mean that the individual trustees will be replaced by a corporate trustee company, to be called FOTH Trustee Company Ltd. Members of the charity will appoint directors of this company, similar to the way in which they currently appoint trustees. The charity will remain in place with its existing constitution only amended to reflect the new corporate trustee arrangement: all financial, operational and employment activities will continue in the same way as before.

The key advantage of the new structure is that it provides limited liability for the trustee body. At present there is no upper limit on the personal liability of each trustee. In an increasingly litigious society this fact has been found to be a major concern and thus a barrier for individuals who would otherwise be keen to become involved in running charities.

Finance

The accounts for the year are included later in this annual report so I will only comment on the following facts:

- Individual donations have fallen this year. We believe this relates primarily to recurring donations made by debit or credit cards through our website. Such cards expire within a few years and unless the originator updates card details the donation will cease. The most effective way for people to donate is by means of either a direct debit or standing order and we are taking steps to encourage uptake of this method
- Income from www.easyfundraising.org.uk is beginning to gain some traction but only 12 individuals have so far signed up. This is a new way for individuals to raise extra money for their favourite charity every time they make an on-line purchase at no cost to the individual.
- Our investment in a new tractor in 2014/5 is beginning to pay off. Our Ranger is more productive and running expenses are significantly lower compared with previous years.

- During the last year we also invested in a new pick up truck and similarly, the impact of this investment in lower running expenses is beginning to show through
- We received a significant legacy during the year which the trustees have allocated to restricted reserves. The trustees undertook a strategy review during the latter half of the year with a brief to recommend how this legacy could be best deployed to help establish a sustainable future for our Charity. The resulting strategy action plan is summarised below.

Strategy action plan

Three initiatives have been established as a result of the strategy review.

- 1. Encourage more community engagement by:
 - a. Establishing a number of special interest groups
 - b. Conducting a user survey
 - c. More targeted communication
- 2. Improve the experience for visitors to the Hurtwood by:
 - a. Renovating key trails
 - b. Improving the physical appearance/landscape e.g. at viewpoints, car parks
 - c. Improving signage
- 3. To achieve these objectives, more resources will be required:
 - a. Invest in equipment (and storage) to improve what we can do ourselves and thereby reducing reliance on contractors
 - b. Investigate the possibility of an apprentice as Deputy Ranger/Warden
 - c. Introduce more volunteering opportunities for minor projects
 - d. Make more use of digital technology e.g. social media
 - e. Develop new approaches to generate the funding that will be required

Reserves

We received a legacy during the year from the late John Donald Webb. This legacy is included in the Designated Legacies Reserve. We have been notified that payment of the balance of the legacy of the late M/s J Burt of Ewhurst will be received during 2017. This will also be added to our Designated Legacies Reserve on receipt.

Following receipt of the aforementioned legacies the trustees have agreed a policy of continuing to invest in equipment where such investment is likely either to reduce costs or improve Ranger productivity. Consequently a decision to invest in a large flail cutter and a new trailer for the tractor was taken at the trustees meeting in December. These investments will improve productivity and reduce the cost of subcontractors during the course of 2017 and beyond.

The trustees will continue to seek ways to deploy Designated Legacies Reserves that result in efficiency and productivity improvements. We also believe it will be possible to allocate some of these reserves to actions designed to improve the Hurtwood visitor experience

The Trustees are confident that the reserves are adequate for a charity of our size.

Risk

The Hurtwood Risk Register is updated regularly to take account of the changing nature of the environment of the Hurtwood (e.g. trail erosion, forestry works), the potential for conflict between different users (e.g. fast moving bikers and horse riders), financial risk and various other issues (e.g. increased fly tipping).

The Trustees have reviewed the updated risk register and are satisfied that appropriate and proportionate action is in place to mitigate the risks identified.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice.

The accounts include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which Friends of the Hurtwood is responsible in law.

Funds

Unrestricted funds represent the funds of Friends of the Hurtwood that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for the general purpose of the trust. Funds designated by the Trustees for a particular purpose are also unrestricted.

Restricted funds consist of monies received for specific purposes. The unspent balances of the funds may not be used for any other purposes unless the Trustees have received, from the donors, express permission to do so.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds where the Trustees have resolved to set aside the funds for a specific purpose.

Designated Legacies Reserve is an unrestricted reserve that the trustees have set aside to fund projects that will enhance the efficiency of the Charity.

Income

Grants from councils and legacies are those receivable for the year. All other income is recognised when it is received.

Depreciation

Depreciation is charged at the following rates:

Tractor - 10% per annum straight line
Pick-up Truck - 20% per annum reducing balance.
Signs and notice boards - 14 1/3% per annum straight line
Other equipment - 20% per annum reducing balance.
Computers and other IT equipment - 33 1/3% per annum straight line

Stocks of merchandise

Stocks of merchandise are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Summary of information required to be included in the Annual Report:

- 1. Name: Friends of the Hurtwood
- 2. <u>Constitution</u>: The Trust is an unincorporated association. The objects are contained in the Constitution adopted on 6th December 2000 and varied since that date. Copies will be available at the Annual Meeting if any Friends wish to see one.
- 3. Number: The registered Charity Number is 200053.
- 4. <u>Members of the Trust (Charity Trustees)</u>: The names of the Trustees appear on page 13. The Constitution prescribes that three named Local Authorities each appoint one trustee for so long as they provide financial support to the Charity; the principal landowners can appoint up to four Trustees and the remaining Trustees are elected by the Friends. The Treasurer appointed by the Trust, is approved by the Annual Meeting of Friends.
- 5. <u>Address</u>: The address of the Charity and the name of the Secretary and Ranger appear on the back of the Annual Report.
- 6. Bankers: Unity Trust Bank PLC, Nine Brindleyplace, Birmingham, B1 2BR
- 7. There are no restrictions on the way in which the Trust operates nor are there any specific investment powers.
- 8. The Trust's objects, which are set out in the Constitution are to administer the public rights of access to land on the Hurtwood placed by landowners within the Trust's control. The policies adopted by the Trust to further the objects are explained in the reports from the Chairman and Ranger.
- 9. The affairs of the Trust are controlled by the Trustees as a body, which meets at least twice a year. During the year the executive authority rested with the Chairman's Management Committee, which supervised the activities of the Secretary and Ranger, which is a full time executive post. This Committee operated during the year on which this Report is made.
