Report of the Managing Committee for the year ended 31 July 2016

The members of the Managing Committee present their report along with the Financial Statements of the Charity for the year ended 31 July 2016.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 7 and comply with the Charity's Constitution, the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16 July 2014.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity is governed by its constitution and was registered with the Charity Commission in 1980. The constitution was reviewed and amended on 10 February 2011.

Managing Committee members are elected for a three year term at the Annual General Meeting which is usually held in October/November. The Managing Committee normally meets six times per year to consider the Charity's affairs.

New Committee Members are appointed from amongst the membership of the chorus.

Objects, Organisation and Activities

The Charity is established to advance, improve, develop and maintain public education in, and foster appreciation of the art and science of music in all its aspects by any means the trustees see fit, including through the presentation of public concerts and recitals in the Cathedral Church of Lichfield and elsewhere.

Members of the chorus comprise:

- a) Active members, who take part in the performance of choral works;
- b) Patrons, who do not take part in performances.

All members pay the annual subscription. The rates for 2015/2016 were as follows:

Full subscription£88.00Senior Citizens£75.00Students£18.00

Patrons £20.00 minimum

Ben Lamb, one of the Directors of Music at the Cathedral, is the Musical Director. Martyn Rawles, Organist of the Cathedral is the accompanist.

In recognition of the free use of the Cathedral for practices and performances, the Dean and Canons of the Cathedral are entitled to membership of the Association without payment of any subscription.

In the event of winding up of the Chorus any surplus assets shall be given or transferred to an organisation having similar objects to those of the Chorus.

Achievements and Performances

The 2015/2016 opening concert, Vivaldi Gloria was tackled with an admirable attention to detail with good ticket sales resulting in a profit of £684.

The Annual Carol concert was popular, with a retiring collection of £815. We are grateful to the Salvation Army for, once again, joining us.

The April concert, Vaughan William's Five Mystical Songs was a finely balanced performance, but with a lower ticket sale resulted in a small profit of £47.

In July the Chorus performed Brahm's German Requiem, together with our newly commissioned work Pritchard's We Remember Them as part of the Lichfield Festival. This was our Festival debut and the new piece commemorated the 100th Anniversary of the Battle of the Somme. There were no revenues.

The chorus acknowledges, with thanks, free use of the Cathedral for rehearsals and concerts and was pleased to donate £5,400 during the year to the Cathedral. The chorus wishes to thank the Dean and Chapter for their continued support.

Financial Review

The attached financial statements show the current state of the finances, which the Committee consider to be sound. Free reserves at 31 July 2016 totalled £24,600.

This falls within the range agreed by the Managing Committee and is held to finance working capital requirements and cover any future shortfall in income.

- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
