STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE & MANAGEMENT

Governance and Internal Control

Governing Document

The Autism Alliance is a charitable company limited by guarantee and was established by the Memorandum and Articles of the Association on 30th September 2005 by which the charity is governed. Its objects are to promote, maintain, improve and advance the education, development, health and welfare of people with autism and/or related conditions. The members of the company are the chief executives of the constituent charities of the Alliance. The members elect at least three (and not more than fifteen) from among their number to be Trustees of the charity and Directors of the company. The members meet in general meeting at least twice a year.

Statement of Trustees's Responsibilities

Company and charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and the incoming resources and application of resources, including the net income or expenditure, of the charity for the year. The charity's income for the year ended 30th September 2016 exceeded £25,000 and therefore external scrutiny of the accounts is required. The Independent Examiner's report can be found on page 5.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the charity's website.

The Trustees have had due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Risk and Internal Control

The Board of Trustees has overall responsibility for ensuring that the Charity has appropriate systems of controls, financial and otherwise, They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities and to provide reasonable assurance that:

- the Charity is operating efficiently and effectively;
- its assets are safeguarded against unauthorised use or disposition;
- proper records are maintained and financial information used within the Charity or for publication is reliable;
- the Charity complies with relevant laws and regulations.

The systems of internal control are designed to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance against material misstatement or loss. They include:

- an annual budget approved by the Board of Trustees;
- regular consideration by the Board of Trustees of financial results, variance from budgets and non-financial performance indicators;
- delegation of authority;
- identification and management of risks.

BUSINESS REVIEW

The Autism Alliance seeks to improve the lives of people with autism. The main activities in the year to 30th September 2016 were:

- sharing good practice among its member charities.
- responding to consultations from Government and others.
- project managing funding from the Department of Health to improve public awareness and understanding of autism and build autism-friendly communities that are accessible for people with autism.
- to manage the training of staff in Job Centres who are looking at the whole experience of people with autism who are capable and keen to work, through funding from the Department of Work and Pensions

In order to facilitate its work, the Alliance has appointed a General Secretary as the sole employee. The charity has low overheads and a positive cash balance.

The charity continued to achieve its objectives throughout the year.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Review of Financial Position

Additional funding was received in the year to 30th September 2016 from a) Department of Health to deliver a project to improve public awareness of autism and to build autism-friendly communities and b) Department of Work and Pensions to train staff in Job Centres

Policy on reserves

It is the policy of the charity that unresticted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six months expenditure. The trustees consider that the reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activites while consideration is given to ways in which the additional funds may continue the charity's current activites while consideration is given to ways in which the additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves of has been maintained throughout the year.

Investments Policy

It is not envisaged that the Alliance will generate sufficient surplus funds to warrant investment. Accordingly no investments policy has been developed.

The charitable organisation has one member of staff.

1 Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. Assets and liabilities are recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the notes to the accounts.

Incoming resources

Donations, legacies and other forms of voluntary income are recognised as incoming resources when receivable, except insofar as they are incapable of financial measurement.

Accumulated funds

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate costs related to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Value added tax

The company's activities are classified as exempt for the purpose of value added tax and the company is unable to reclaim the value added tax which it suffers on its expenses. Expenditure in these financial statements is therefore shown inclusive of value added tax.
