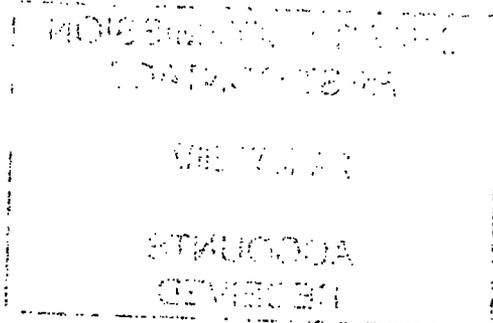

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

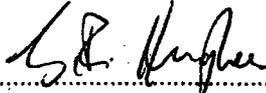
Risk management

**INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF
JAMESTON COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION**

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2016 set out on pages five to ten.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is required.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under Section 145 of the 2011 Act
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission (under Section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act); and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of examiner's statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statements below.

Independent examiner's qualified statement

The trustees have prepared receipts and payments accounts and the accounts show cash received in the year of £3,735 however no records have been kept to match the record of income received to the bankings made and cash balances were retained unbanked.

In connection with my examination, no other matter except that referred to in the above paragraph has come to my attention:

- (1) which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the requirements
- to keep accounting records in accordance with Section 130 of the 2011 Act; and
 - to prepare accounts which accord with the accounting records and comply with the accounting requirements of the 2011 Act

- (2) to which, in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Equipment, Fixtures & Fittings - Straight line over 4 years

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Under the terms of the Welsh Assembly Government CFAP grant, the grant must only be used for the Jameston Community Hall Project which is to build an annexe to the existing hall, to provide a separate meeting room, toilets, kitchen facilities, disabled access and parking, also to purchase the freehold of the property from the Church.

The Project must comply with appropriate EU State Aid requirements and all relevant UK legislation, all relevant permission, consents and approvals are obtained and all relevant statutory procedures are complied with.

The Welsh Ministers reserve the right at any time to recover the Grant, in whole or in part, to the extent that it is not used for eligible purposes or if the Welsh Ministers consider that any other Terms and Conditions are not being fulfilled.

The Charles Hayward Foundation Fund was received for the purpose of constructing a new floor in the community hall, this was completed in 2013.

The Garfield Weston Foundation Fund was received as contribution towards Phase 2 Project costs, these were completed during 2013.

The Welsh Church Act Fund was received for purchasing kitchen equipment and other development costs, this was completed during 2013.

The Bernard Sunley Charitable Foundation was received as a contribution to Phase 2 costs. This was partly spent in 2013 and is expected to be complete in 2014.

No adjustments have been made for volunteer hours.
