Trustees annual report for the year ending 31st December 2016

Continuing to celebrate 30 years



In December 2015, Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship had been meeting together for 30 years, so we spent 2016 celebrating this achievement.

On the weekend of our Church Anniversary in March, the leader of the Ground level Network, Stuart Bell and his wife Irene, visited the fellowship to celebrate with us on the Saturday afternoon. We were joined by friends from a variety of Churches in the town and from across the area. This was a significant time as Ground level have overseen and supported the Church right from our first public meeting in 1986.

On the Sunday following Stuart's visit, the whole Church celebrated with a cake and a photograph together (above) as well as great worship and fellowship together.

We also had a visit during the year from a couple of missionaries who we have supported over many of our years together. Tim & Linda Ng from Macau visited us in June and shared about their work with Macau prison Ministries, also how they were now believing God was calling them to ministry in the Manchester area of the UK.



Church Life

Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship meets every Sunday at 10.30AM at Hope House in Mablethorpe. The Sunday morning service consists of worship, bible teaching/preaching, testimonies, communion and ministry. We also hold a monthly evening celebration which we share and alternate with Alford Community Church.

Mid-week fellowship groups provide additional teaching on the week's theme along with an opportunity to meet with friends. We also hold a prayer meeting every Monday morning.

Our teaching themes this year have been The Paraclesis teaching course from CWR, The life course from CPO and the prayer course teaching from The 24/7 prayer movement.

Highlights of the year include 6 baptisms which took place on Easter Sunday and a visit from our long term friend Bishop Isaac Etidia from Nigeria in the autumn.





Open House

Open House operates Tuesday to Friday every week. It provides free drinks, low cost meals (free to those in need) friendship, support, help with calls and forms to those who are vulnerable or lonely. We can also signpost people for extra help with addictions, housing, food larder, furniture or budgeting.

Because of the work it carries out, Open House has also become the local contact point for those who are homeless. We have a reserve fund to help people facing homelessness and this to provide sleeping bags, tents, food as well as a washing machine and sho wers which make up part of the Open house facilities.

The Open house team also helped get permanent housing for 5 people during the year, with the homeless fund providing the landlords' bond where needed.

We also have supported a number of people who have addictions to drugs, alcohol or gambling. In some cases, these people have been recommended to come to us by other charities that are working with them.

During the year, our Open House team have worked closely with social workers, Addaction, Mental Health Team, Probation Service, Doctors surgery and other local charities to support a wide range of people.

We provide free meals to those in need and this year, approximately half of the food we supply is free of charge to people in need

Open House also provides a meeting place for other charities, in particular P3 who hold a weekly drop in service. There is a craft activities session on a Thursday for people with learning difficulties.

We have a regular group of around 50 people with around 5-7 people coming in each week for further help and support.



Community Bus @ Hope House

At the end of April 2016, a brand new Minibus was collected by Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship from Mellor Coachworks in Lancashire. The bus was provided under the Department of Transport Mini Bus scheme.

The new bus will serve a number of local community groups and following an initial launch evening, 14 groups have been recruited to the scheme.

The new bus provides 16 passenger seats and disabled access for up to 4 wheel chairs.

We have also recruited and trained a team of drivers for the bus, some who volunteer for specific groups and others who work as 'pool drivers' and are available for any group.

The bus has been used by our own 'Bridge Youth' for home pick ups on club nights and for special trips to theme parks and bowling.





The Bridge Youth Group

The Bridge youth group meet every Friday evening during term time. The group ages range from 10-14. Activities are organised every week and have included special overnight weekends, trips out to Laser Quest, bowling and a theme park. These were part funded by the generosity of the Colin Batts Family Trust.

We received funding from the Dulverton Trust to purchase new equipment for our club including a pool table, air hockey, table tennis and a table football.

The group has maintained a healthy attendance during the year with around 18 –20 children attending each week.

The group provides a bus service for children to be collected and returned home each week. A number of the Bridge attended the Church Sunday service as part of their sleepover.



GLOW-WORMS - TODDLERS GROUP

For twenty years, Glow –worms toddlers group has provided a friendly and safe meeting place for mums, dads, family members, carers, their babies and children. The group meets every Friday at Hope House from 9.30—11.00AM where a range of toys and activities are available for the children.

Songs and rhymes are always popular at the end of each session as are the craft activities and refreshments for all.

For Easter all the children were given a 'Real Easter Egg' which included the Easter Story.

Special events have included The Barnardo's Toddle, A well attended Christmas party which was attended by Santa. All children also received a 'Real Advent Calendar' which included the Christmas story.

Glow-worms is ran by a small team of volunteers under the leadership of Judy Collins the Church's Family and Community worker. 50% of Judy's salary was funded by The Joseph Rank trust for a 3 year period which ended in April 2016. The trustees are very grateful for this support.



Volunteers

The majority of work at Hope House is carried out by a committed and hard working team of volunteers who provide everything from cleaning, catering, maintenance, administration finance as well as worship, pastoral and ministry support.

We estimate that a team of approximately 25 people provide a minimum of 100 hours of volunteering every week which makes a huge difference to the church and to the lives of our service users.

The leadership are very grateful to the volunteers for their tireless support and hard work.

We have also been able to provide some volunteering opportunities to a number of people for whom the opportunity has helped overcome issues of health, isolation and addiction.



Ground level Network

As a small local Church we value being part of The Ground Level Network. We receive monthly teaching, quarterly leaders day, special training events and the annual leaders conference in Swanwick. We were also visited by the leader of the network Stuart bell and his wife on the occasion of our 30th Anniversary event in March. The whole Church also attends the Ground Level Christian celebration at Lincoln in August.



Churches Together

Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship continues to be actively involved with Churches together in Mablethorpe, Trusthorpe & Sutton on Sea.

The highlight of the year has been the establishment of two 'Open The Book' teams who go into two local schools every week to carry out school assemblies. These have been very well received by both the schools and pupils. Churches together also organised a prayer gathering to start the year, Easter March of Witness, Christmas mince pie give away, a fund raising sponsored walk, carol singing at the Christmas late night shopping events and a quiz night social.

Churches Together once again held a 'poverty lunch' to raise a wareness of the issues of homelessness and the money raised was given to the homes fund at MCF.

The churches also organised a summer lunch club for local families during the summer holidays.





Leadership & Governance:

Mablethorpe Christian Fello wship is a registered charity No 1099116.

Leadership team:

Our leadership team are responsible for the spiritual direction of the Church. They oversee the teaching and preaching programme and approve appointments within the church. They also provide help and oversight to our various group leaders. Our leadership team meet every two weeks throughout the year.

Public benefit:

As a Church with a **community focus**, our public benefit can be clearly seen. We provided:

Morning service every week. Our morning service is modern and one of few services in the area that will appeal to those who have no Church background. We also provide a crèche and children's work

Open House 4 days a week to anyone who needs help, support, friendship or a meal (and provided free of charge to anybody who cannot afford to make a contribution). The Open house team have worked closely with other community workers to assist local people in need. We work with a growing number of homeless and people who are struggling with addictions.

For children and youth we provide:

Glow-worms mums and toddlers provides support and help to local carers and families.

The Bridge for young people.

We manage and operate a **Community bus** that provides support to a 14 local community groups.

We administer a **homeless fund** that provides help and support to local homeless people. During the winter of 2016, our homeless fund provided bonds for 3 people to obtain accommodation.

A summer lunch club for local children to have access to lunches during summer holidays. (provided at Hope House in conjunction with Churches Together)

Risk Management:

As Christian organisation we have to have a balanced view between risk and trusting God. Our main source of funding is our weekly offerings which the trustees monitor on a monthly basis. Our members continue to be generous in their giving and we have increased our financial reserves this year but our financial commitments mean that this risk is classed as high.

Our financial reserves have also improved throughout the year and are considered adequate for our present needs.

We carry out regular assessment of risks to which our members and users of our facilities are exposed.

Plans for 2017:

- We have seen increased numbers of homeless being sent to us for support and help. We are exploring ways to help these people more effectively.
- We are looking to find funding and support to enable our Open House manager, to be employed for more hours so as to improve the service to those who come to us for help.
- After 7 years of heavy use, Hope House is in need of some refurbishment. We would like to fit wipe clean flooring throughout our café, lounge and reception areas which will make it more suitable for its present use
