Objectives and aims

The objectives of the club are the promotion of community participation in healthy recreation, in particular by the provision of facilities for swimming and the teaching of swimming.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Organisational Structure of the club

The Club is governed by a constitution dated 31 May 2012. The trustees of the fund are the following:

Subject to compliance with the aims of the charity, the trustees are the authority for the expenditure from reserves.

Review of activities

During the year the club continued the provision of swimming facilities.

The trustees are satisfied that all activities undertaken on behalf of the club are in accordance with the governing document and are in keeping with the aims and strategy of the charity. There were no significant changes during the year.

The club is indebted to the volunteers that make contributions to the running of events and galas, raising funds and especially running the squad and teaching sessions. The club thanks all the teachers and coaches who are continuing the progress of the Club's swimmers.

FUTURE PLANS

The Club has worked closely with a local school to offer free swimming lessons and during the coming year we plan to further expand the provision of teaching swimming to the local community. The expansion of the teaching facilities will have a number of beneficial impacts:

- * Increasing the number of children swimming on a regular basis.
- * Expansion of the Club member base.
- * Additional regular revenue.
- * Additional water time for the Club enabling additional training hours to be allocated.

The Club is also working closely with Sandwell District Council to ensure that the new leisure centre planned for the district can properly accommodate the swimming club for the coming years. To this end we have requested that the tender include:

- * Learner pool with moveable floor.
- * Additional deck space to allow mobile seating to be used for galas.
- * Multiple anti-wave lane rope attachment points to allow for wider lanes in training.

Such facilities would allow the clubs to hold not only club galas but also inter-club galas and also host for the first time swimming leagues.

The club also plans to expand the open water sessions during the season using the grant monies allocated. This will help develop the triathlon side of the club and help promote any events the club puts on.

The above activities will raise additional revenue for the Club, which will then be used to assist its objectives of promotion of community participation in healthy recreation, in particular by the provision of facilities for swimming and the teaching of swimming.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 September 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

General fund

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Volunteer help

The value of voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.
