COMMENCEMENT OF ACTIVITIES

Supporting Dalit Children was formed in March 2008.

The object of the charity is to advance the education of Dalit children living in Karnataka, Southern India and to relieve the poverty of Dalit children in particular, but not exclusively by the provision of funding towards their education and living expenses.

The trustees of Supporting Dalit Children organise various fund raising events throughout the year as well as approach individuals and groups for private sponsorship and support.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity's objects and regulations are regulated by a trust deed dated 8th May 2008, and under that Deed is constituted as a charitable trust. It is a registered charity, number 1125102.

The trust deed provides for three trustees - the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of Supporting Dalit Children. Were there a requirement for new trustees, these would be recommended and agreed by the existing trustees.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

<u>Report of the Trustees</u> For The Year Ended 31 December 2016

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Grantmaking

During the course of the year Supporting Dalit Children made 7 payments totalling £118,950.05 to the bank account of Loyola Xavier and Loyola Kapepaladi School in Manvi, and funded primarily the students' day to day school expenses as well as Kapepaladi school boarding hostel and school bus expenses.

A grant of £8,006 was given by the JCT Trust for the purpose of funding 3 community halls that will be multi-purpose tuition centres, women's empowerment halls and tailoring centres, Provision for 24 sewing machines for these 3 community halls was included in JCT's Trust payment.

A Shoes and Socks Appeal was launched to buy shoes and socks for all 304 students at Loyola Kapepaladi School, Pannur.

A total of 32 sewing machines were bought for the Tailoring Project in 2016.

The charity is run voluntarily with the Trustees and their families funding office expenses and all travel expenses to India. Therefore, expenses are always kept to a minium; in 2016 expenses totalled just £415 and were primarily for Accountancy costs and printing costs for Newsletters.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Fundraising activities

Individual sponsorship increased throughout the year for both schools and also the Sixth form College and University.

Supporting Dalit Children is unilaterally supporting the running costs of Kapepaladi School in Pannur through sponsorships, fundraising, individual donations and donations from charitable trusts.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees consider it prudent that unrestricted reserves should be sufficient to cover advance sums needed for the preliminary booking of the next fund raising event. The level of reserves is monitored and reviewed by the trustees throughout the year.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Supporting Dalit Children

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2016 set out on pages four to seven.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
