Introduction

This is our first report as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and relates to the period 2 Oct 2015 to 31 Dec 2016. This has been another encouraging year with lots of positive work going on as our relationship with our partner organisations continues to grow and develop. Our activities are expanding and becoming more creative and involving a wider variety of people.

Management Committee

The Management Committee has met five times in the past 15 months. The business of the Committee has included work on:

- The development of a Facebook page with an online giving facility
- The content of the Lease agreement between MCCP and The Manor Parish
- Drawing up an extended programme of activities •
- Ensuring we become sustainable as an organisation
- Reviewing the needs and opportunities within the local community
- Three new grant applications to Veolia, Power to Change and the Terry Bramall Foundation •

Church-Related Community Work Minister

Simon Loveitt has now completed two years with the Project and continues to develop relationships within the community and build the capacity of the organisation. He provides a valued service to the S2 Foodbank in his role as Treasurer and continues to attend a wide range of community meetings providing support where he can.

Programme of Activities

We have had another year of exciting activities including our usual Christmas, Easter and summer activities for families and children at St Swithun's. We also introduced a Harvest activity for the first time and we plan to add a Valentine one this next year. We have continued our 'Stay, Play and Eat' activities at William Temple in partnership with Manor Community Childcare Centre and MASKK along with Best Start. This past year saw two large community events taking place and we, as an organisation, were key partners - Everyone's Festival was held on the 13th August and a Community Bonfire, was held on the 4th November. In December we held another community carol singing event with many more people joining us this year.

Priorities for the Future

Future priorities include:

- · Continuing to develop and sustain relationships and partnerships within our community and wider
- Raising the funds for the Temple Park building work
- Obtaining a Lease agreement for the use of the building
- Continuing to develop our vision for the creative use of both William Temple and St Swithun's.

Notes to the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2016

1 Accounting Policies

a) Formation of the CIO and definition of accounting periods

The Manor Church and Community Project was given charitable status by the Charity Commission on 2 October 2015. Before this date MCCP was an unregistered charity.

Throughout this Financial Statement the period 2015 refers to 1 January 2015 to 1 October 2015 and the period 2016 refers to 2 October 2015 to 31 December 2016.

The reduced financial year for 2015 has been used as a starting point for the funds transferred into the new CIO on the 2 October 2015. In future years the financial accounting period will revert to being a calendar year ending 31 December.

b) Accounting practice

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in January 2015 (SORP 2015).

c) Donations/grants and fund accounting

Donations and grants received for the general purposes of the Project are included in unrestricted funds.

d) Resources expended

Expenditure is included on an accruals basis.
