Structure, governance and management

The PCC is a corporate body established by the Church of England. The PCC operates under the Parochial Church Council Powers Measure (1956) and was registered with the Charity Commission on 19 August 2013, number 1153456.

The PCC meets on a regular basis to review activities and make plans to achieve its objectives of mission. In addition, there are informal meetings of officers to ensure progress is made.

In October 2010 the PCC, as part of The York City Centre Churches, appointed a Priest-in-Charge.

Mission Statement

- We exist to reveal Christ through worship and loving service.
- Our churches offer Christian hospitality, care and hope.
- -St Helen's and St Martin's are, for everyone, sacred places where worship to God is offered.
- St Helen's is committed to contributing to the life of the city.
- St Martin's promotes peace and reconciliation.

Our vision is that we are led forward and motivated spiritually, prayerfully, joyfully and enthusiastically to show that we are a living church portraying and offering Christian love and values to the community around us and to those who suffer in the wider world.

In 2016 two funerals were held in St Helen and one wedding blessing. These were the first such occasional offices held in St Helen for over a decade. There was also a baptism in St Martin. We are please to note that two marriage services have been booked for 2017.

At 31 December 2016 there were 42 on the Church Electoral Roll.

In 2013 St Helen's Church embarked on a project to re-establish St Helen's as a worshipping community in the City Centre. It now has Celtic style services and Eucharists with Classical Music on a regular basis. In addition to increasing the number of services, there has also been an increase in the number of concerts and other arts events, hosted in the main by the churchwardens.

In 2017, we are implementing plans to engage with those who attend concerts and events. We are exploring ways to seek to view those who attend as pilgrims, rather than visitors and tourists.

We continue to be grateful to the churchwardens for their invaluable work in both churches and for the work of the Assistant Curate.

The PCC adopted the Safeguarding Policy of York Diocese and has a named Parish Safeguarding Representative. In 2016, there were no regulated activities for children and vulnerable adults organised by the PCC.

The PCC has complied with section 5 Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 (duty to have regard to the House of Bishops' guidance relating to the safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults)

A freewill contribution of £1,250 to the Diocesan Common Fund was made 2016.

We are indebted to parishes throughout the Diocese who contribute to the parish share to enable us to have clergy in our parish and are grateful for the work of retired clergy.

The repairs to the fabric of our historic churches are in the main paid for by the Feoffees. We are grateful for the work of the Feoffees who review the quinquennial inspection report and provide the necessary funds.

Reserves policy

Reserves are in place to ensure that there is enough funding in place for at least 12 months and there is a contingency for the organs.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016

1. Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006, using the receipts and payments basis.

Funds

General funds represent the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application on the general purposes of the PCC. Restricted funds represent income which is to be expended on the restricted purposes intended by the donor or for a specific PCC activity intended by the donor.

Fixed Assets

Consecrated land and buildings and movable church furnishings.

Consecrated and beneficed property is excluded from accounts by s.10 (2) of the Charities Act 2011. No value is placed on movable church furnishings held by the churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a faculty for disposal since the PCC considers this to be inalienable property. All expenditure incurred during the year on consecrated or benefice buildings and movable church furnishings, whether maintenance or improvement, is written off as expenditure.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL OF THE ECCLESIASTICAL PARISH OF ST HELEN WITH ST MARTIN, YORK

I report on the financial statements of The Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St Helen with St Martin, York (the PCC) for the year ended 31 December 2016, which are set out on pages 4 to 8.

This report is made solely to the PCC, as a body, in accordance with section 154 of the Charities Act 2011. My independent examiner's work has been undertaken so that I might state to the PCC those matters I am required to state to them in an independent examiner's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, I do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the PCC as a body for my independent examiner's work, for this report, or for the opinions I have formed.

Respective responsibilities of the PCC and independent examiner

The PCC, as the charity's trustees, are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. The PCC considers that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act), and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the financial statements under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the PCC and a comparison of the financial statements presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the financial statements, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the financial statements present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.
