Structure, governance and management

The charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) is governed by a constitution adopted on 06 Jan 2016.

The trustees of the charity are appointed by the members at the AGM.

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects

The objects of the CIO are to provide for the benefit of the inhabitants of Roundhay, Oakwood, and the surrounding areas a community room and/or other facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation for the public at large in the interests of social welfare with the object of improving their condition of life.

The charity's main activities

The provision and maintenance of Roundhay Parochial Hall which houses several rooms which are let out to community and other groups at very reasonable rates.

Public benefit statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our Trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular the advancement of community development.

Achievements and performance

The most significant achievement this year has been the transfer of the assets of Roundhay St Johns Parochial Hall (registered charity ref 251705) to Roundhay Parochial Hall (registered charity ref 1165064) the new CIO structure on 31.7.16, the culmination of a year's work by the Trustees. This project has engendered a new fit-forpurpose constitution, as well as the reduced personal liability to the Trustees, which we hope will enable easier appointment of new Trustees in the future.

This year also we have invested in more cleaning hours for the Hall, via the appointment of a new cleaner in the spring which has made a noticeable difference to the Hall environment.

On the maintenance side we have replaced some wooden windows / frames with new made to measure wooden double glazed units, in a matching style to the previous ones. Other than that we have been "saving up" for the toilet refurbishment, as well as applying for grants towards the same goal.

Financial review

The net receipts for the period were £35,397, including net receipts of £33,672 on unrestricted funds and net receipts of £1,725 on restricted funds. £34,329 of these receipts was a transfer from the unincorporated charity.

Reserves policy

The charity's free cash reserves at the year end were £33.672.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Roundhay Parochial Hall

I report on the accounts of the charity for the period ended 31 December 2016, which are set out on pages 5 to 8.

Basis of accounting

The trustees have taken advantage of section 133 of the Charities Act 2011 and have prepared the accounts on a receipts and payments basis.

Taxation

As a registered charity the organisation benefits from rates relief and is generally exempt from income tax and capital gains tax but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the cost of those items to which it relates.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the accounts.
