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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2016

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2016. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES Objectives and activities

Activities include providing financial support towards the educational needs of children from deprived families; helping to deliver education by providing access to educational materials and development programmes for study as well as building shelter for the homeless. Other projects include wheelchair distribution, winter clothing distribution, sewing machine distribution among poor women, orphan sponsorship, Qurbani projects and financial support for widowed women. The charity continues to provide humanitarian assistance to those who need it most with the aim to empower society, and invest in the educational needs of the future generation of Bangladesh.

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they abide by the Charity Commissions guidance on public benefit in complying with Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to public benefit in meeting its objectives and activities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Blankets Distribution in Winter

Winter is a difficult time for poor and needy people in Bangladesh as many of them do not have adequate housing or heating system to keep them warm. In 2016 we have distributed around 1,000 blanket and so far to date we have distributed around 8,000 blankets, The distribution of blankets took place in Sylhet, Manikgonj, Rajnogor, Habigonj, Biswanath, Moulvibazar, Sreemongol, Balagonj, Sunamgonj, Kumilla, Dhaka and Kanaigat.

Qurbani Meat Distribution

Qurbani is the only time many poor and needy people consume meat and Alhamdulillah since inception G&Y has been carrying out Qurbani projects in many different parts of Bangladesh. So far we have carried out over 3,000 Qurbanis and in 2016 we carried out around 220 qurbanis consisting of 5 goats and 26 Cows in Sreemongol, Sylhet, Rajnogor, Sunamgonj, Habigonj, Moulvibazar, Balagonj, Kanaigat, Mutigonj, Comilla, Dhaka (Savar), Chattok, Borguna and Borleka.

Tube well Project

Clean water is must for good health and unfortunately many poor and needy people in Bangladesh do not have access to clean water in Bangladesh. In 2016 we've installed around 10 tubes well and to date since our inception we've installed around 90 tubewell in Sylhet, Habiganj, Sunamganj and Maulvibazar district.

Medical & Blind Project

G&Y has been helping poor and needy families with healthcare support since inception especially in the area of medical operation, treatment, cataract eye support and blind support.

In 2016 we helped around 270 people with cataract checkups, 50 with cataract operation, 15 people with operational and 45 with general treatments and medicine.

The average cost of operation is around £3,000 and general treatment is around £200

Education & Blind Hafiz Support Project

G &E has been supporting various educational projects in Bangladesh such as Women training centre, hifz sponsorship, higher education scholarship and book distribution.

It takes about three years on average and the sponsorship generally covers their tuition fees, boarding cost, food, books and other general day to day cost.

Around 750 students have been supported with Hifz sponsorship and 4 students with higher education scholarship.

We have also been supporting around 65 blind students with their educational and other needs.

The cost of sponsoring one poor or blind student to become hafiz of the $\,$ Quran cost is around £300 per annum $\,$

Housing Project

A permanent decent home is a farfetched dream for many poor and needy people. Alhamdulillah G&Y has built around 85 homes in 2016 and around 210 homes to-date with 2 bedroom and veranda for these poor and needy people making their dream come true.

We built all the houses in Sreemongol, Moulvibazar, Sylhet, Shunamgonj, Buddimontopur, Komolgonj, Nobigonj, Dhaka and Hobigonj.

Ramadan Iftar Programme

Ramadan is a difficult time for many poor and needy people due to the lack of work and earnings. G&Y provides Ramadan food parcel to poor and needy families which generally contains the following items Rice, Onions, Cooking Oil, Lentils, Dates, Chick Peas, and Salt.

To date we have distributed around £80,000 in Ramadan projects.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The cost of one food parcel is £30 and can feed an average family of four for one month. Fitra is £5 per person

Distribution took place in Sylhet, Hobigonj, Shunamgonj, Balagonj, Moulvibazar, Nobigonj, Dhaka, Borlekha, Komolgonj, Rajnogor, Gulapgonj, Chattok & Chitagonj.

Sewing Machine & Rickshaw Distribution

Many poor people struggle to purchase their tools of earning and spend a lifetime renting and hiring from other people.

In 2016 we distributed around 70 sewing machine and 23 Rickshaws. G&Y to-date has provided around 170 sewing machines to poor women and around 105 Rickshaw to poor and needy man so they can own it and earn more money.

The cost of a sewing machine is £70 and £180 for a rickshaw

Distribution took place in Moulvibazar, Kanaigat, Sylhet, Jokigonj, and Sreemongol

Wheelchair Distribution

Wheelchair is a great and easy way for disabled people to move around but not many poor and needy families can afford it.

In 2016 we distributed 750 wheelchairs to share poor and needy families and so far we have distributed around 4,000 wheelchairs.

The distribution of the Wheelchair took place in Dhaka, Noriel, Kumilla, Sylhet, Habigonj, Moulvibazar, Sreemongol, Sunamgonj and Balagonj, Manikgonj, Fanny District, Dhaka Lokkipur, Khulna, Bhula, Brammonbaria, Borishal, Bagerhat, Chittagong & Joshor.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Governing document

Goreeb and Eatheem Trust Fund is formed under a Declaration of Trust dated 11 January 2008.

Organisational structure & Governance

Goreeb & Eatheem Trust Fund is a UK based registered charity organisation established in 2007 with the aim of helping to eradicate poverty for children and poor people throughout Bangladesh. The organisation currently has 10 Trustee board members. The Trustees are elected and operate in accordance with the Trust Deed and Governing constitution of the charity.

The trustees are responsible for preparing the annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations. The trustees are required to maintain adequate accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy the charity's financial transactions.

Goreeb & Eatheem Trust Fund works with delivery partner organisations towards achieving common goals. These include educational institutions as well as other non governmental organisations.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings Computer equipment

- 20% on cost

- 25% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Trustees remuneration and benefit

In accordance with clause 25 (c) (d) of the constitutions trustees remunerations shown in the accounts amounted to £8,430 for services provided by Alum Uddin in running administrative work and duties for the charity.
