CHAIRMAN S REPORT

Rainbow of Hope has been providing a service since 1995 and has been a Registered Charity since 2001. This Charity has been involved in helping to relieve people suffering from poverty and distress, in particular, but not exclusively the homeless in the City of Cardiff and the surrounding area. In addition to a new service introduced in 1996 is the support of food parcels to those seeking asylum. All the work is undertaken by volunteers, their time is given freely for no financial return.

Principal Activities

This year has seen many significant changes in the Charity.

The Ark Dropin center has had a complete new kitchen installed including a dish washer, we have also had a shower put in. We have also had new vinyl flooring throughout the center. These were all gifted to us by a very generous donor. Our food hygiene rating has been raised up to number four. We have a training session once a month to ensure we maintain this standard.

We have increased our opening times for the Homeless to include a Friday evening once a month, this is in addition to our five and a half days, approximately 150 plus meals are now served each week. Numbers have also increased in other areas; our Joseph Storehouse provides between 250 / 300 food parcels monthly.

We continue to run English Classes three afternoons a week. Welcome the Stranger is our Asylum seeker outreach on a Thursday morning which is attended by roughly 40 people who all receive a parcel of various items including fresh fruit and vegetables bought from the local market.

Our Bible Class saw two Baptisms taking place in our Center last Aug. We have twelve Ministers who share the Gospel daily in our sessions. We run a Men's Group A Women's group, Also a Discipleship group.

our Legal Case Worker is kept extremely busy and has seen an increased number of clients this year. Paradise Run our (soup run) on the street continues to 365 nights of the year. This year we also organized a Community Picnic.

We are linking in with many more organizations, Hostels, Mental Health Teams, Probation and Social workers. We do a lot of outside visits to homes of those who need additional support. All this work is achieved because of the amazing volunteers that give so much to help those in need.

RESULTS for 2016

Donations and gifts increased in 2016 from £29452 To £30826, overall costs have decreased than the previous year.
