Report of the trustees for the year ended 31 December 2016

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2016. The trustees who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The objects of the trust are to provide for the maintenance and repair of meeting houses and burial grounds, as well as to support the poor and needy Quakers in Wensleydale and Swaledale, and other such good and charitable deeds and works of piety as Trustees may decide. In furtherance of these objectives the Trustees rely on the oversight of local premises committees who attend to routine care and maintenance of Meeting Houses and adjacent burial grounds. A Managing Agent has the care of the burial grounds that are not attached to Meeting Houses. Requests to support poor and need Quakers are received through the Wensleydale and Swaledale Area Meeting Overseers. We also receive direct requests for charitable support and Trustees, in the usual manner of The Religious Society of Friends, discern these requests, these include, for example, requests from neighbouring Quaker meetings.

Main aims

It is the aim of the Trust to update and upgrade all the Tenanted properties and Meeting Houses. It is hoped that over the years when a property becomes vacant we can refurbish them to a high standard.

Achievements and performance

Meeting Houses

We have continues to upkeep our three main Meeting Houses based in Leyburn, Countersett and Bainbridge.

Grants

We have made five grants in 2016 to Quaker Homeless Trust, Hammersmith Quaker Meeting House, Wensleydale Tournament of Song, Just the Job and Northern Friends Summer Shindig.

Let Properties

We have eleven residential let properties, three meeting houses and five burial grounds.

New Properties

There were no new properties acquired in the year.

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2016

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Charities Act 1993.

1.2. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Gifts donated for resale are included as incoming resources within activities for generating funds when they are sold.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

1.3. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes including the charity's shop.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
