Trustees Annual Report for the year ended 31 March 2017

Major Activities and Achievements in the Year

The Group made a surplus of £9,560 for the year and has an accumulated surplus of £61,441 This compares to the surplus last year of £7,258. The increase has come from subscriptions and fund raising activities

Net Subscriptions are slightly up at £8,739 compared to £7,510 in 2016. Subscription prices were not increased this year and will remain the same in the coming year.

Pack night activities are expected to be funded out of subs while trips and camps are expected to be selffunding. The total net subs plus activity revenue of £27,154 (15: £28,460) does cover the activity cost of £17,430 (16:£17,422). 2017 receipts include £1,695 net advance receipts for Summer camp (2016: £1,856) and £87 for Totem camp

During the year the group raised a net of £5276 (2016:£3,707) for the General Fund from fund raising activities(2016:£3,707); Christmas tree sale, jumble sale, 2nd hand unifrm and from GAYL.

Included in the accumulated funds is a surplus of £0,000 (16: £1,089 surplus) allocated to the Jamboree fund has been returned to the general fund as not used for Jamboree.

During the year the group spent £3,887 on new tents and tent repairs(equipment) and £364 on general maintenance (repair to doors, door guards).

The running costs (electricity and water) of the Montpelier Park Hall totalled £1,039 for the year- in line with last year. A new electricity contract had been arranged to lower the running costs for next year.

The terms of the new lease would mean that the Group will be responsible for internal & external maintenance. We are now nearing completion of the lease agreement

There is a provision left in the accounts from 2007 for potential maintenance costs of \pounds 1,600 (16: \pounds 1,600). This is now to be used to cover the cost of exceptional maintenance of the hall. Once the provision has been fully utilised money will have to be raised from fund raising or increased subscriptions

The Group is a trust established under its rules which are common to all Groups.

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules of the Scout Association.

The accounts have been drawn up on an accruals basis, which is consistent with the previous year.

I report on the accounts of the Group for the year ended 31 March 2016 which are set out on pages 1 to 6.
