The advancement of education particularly but not exclusively providing free out of school tuition to primary school pupils from low income families.

Summary of the Main Activities Undertaken for the Public Benefit in Relation to the Charity's Objects

AIM runs weekly out of school tutoring classes for children from low income families. These classes are primarily focused on helping the children prepare for the 11+ Kent Test, which is the selection test for Grammar School places in secondary education.

During school holidays the frequency and length of classes is increased.

Children are selected for AIM on the basis of income and academic suitability. Places are only given to children from low income families.

AIM classes:

- familiarise the children with the process and requirements of the Kent Test
- raise the children's educational aspirations and building their confidence
- consolidate and build on the learning they receive at school
- provide a comfortable learning environment alongside others who are similarly able.

Achievements & Performance

Statutory Declaration

Summary of the Main Achievements of the Charity for the Year

AIM Achieve Inspire Motivate ("AIM") was formed as a CIO on 20 May 2016, and registered with the Charity Commission on 21 June 2016. AIM had been previously operating as AIM, but under the umbrella of The Number One Community Trust, registered charity number 1092910. On 21 June 2016, AIM was registered in its own right, and took full responsibility for the tutoring and educational activities from Number One. There is no longer any link, formally or informally, between the two charities.

During this period of this report, which is part year, AIM ran weekly 1.5 hour preparation classes that were attended by 11 children from local, low income families. During the school summer holidays, July and August 2016, additional classes were run in preparation for the 11+ test in early September 2016.

AIM also provided the children with two extra-curricular outings. This included a motivational trip to the cinema, and an outward bound type team-building morning, provided free of charge by The Bethany School, an independent school in Goudhurst, Kent.

- AIM classes were attended by 11 children between June and December 2016
- Eight children from the programme sat the Kent Test in September 2016, six (75%) of whom passed the test and were selected for Grammar Schools. Three children from the programme did not take the test due to changes in family circumstances (moving away from Kent).
- The trustees applied for grants and were successful in securing £5,000 during this financial period, £3,000 of which has been carried forward to fund the programme in 2017.

Financial Review

Brief Statement of the Charity's Policy on Reserves

The charity aims to secure sufficient funding through applying for grants in order to continue the programme for a new cohort of children in the next financial year.

AIM financial year runs January to December, which covers the time each cohort of beneficiaries is on the AIM programme. Each cohort is a different group of beneficiaries. There is no need to retain reserves in order to complete the work with a cohort over more than one financial year. A cohort is not recruited until funds are in place to complete the AIM programme for them.
