The Trustees' of the Melton Mowbray Building Society Charitable Foundation are pleased to present their 19th Annual Report and Accounts for the year ended 31 March 2017.

History

The Melton Mowbray Building Society Charitable Foundation was launched on 26 March 1998 to promote and support Charitable and Community activity within the Counties of Leicestershire, Lincolnshire and Rutland. The establishment of the Foundation was an initiative of the Melton Mowbray Building Society which, since its own inception in 1875, has been committed to supporting the local community in which it operates.

Objectives

The principal objective of the Foundation is to direct its resources towards those less advantaged individuals and supporting organisations within a local catchment area of a 15 mile radius of the Building Society's branch offices in Melton Mowbray, Grantham and Oakham.

The areas of need supported by the Foundation are:

- Young people, particularly those who are disadvantaged
- Vulnerable groups such as the frail elderly, people with physical disability, people with learning difficulties or those who are mentally ill
- Small neighbourhood groups in areas experiencing the greatest disadvantage
- Communities and voluntary organisations seeking assistance in the achievement of social and community development

In carrying out the objectives of the Foundation the Trustees' have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

In 2016 the Trustees became beneficiaries of a sum of £81,566.67 which was received from the Executors of the late Mrs June Roper in accordance with her Will. June was a very keen sports woman and set out within her legacy a request that her gift was used to support sports development. She trusted the Melton Mowbray Building Society Charitable Foundation to faithfully execute her wishes and after careful consideration the Trustees decided to establish the June Roper Sporting Trust to support charities or non-profit making organisations or individuals from an underprivileged background with a focus on sport.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees' and Examiner
