# **REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES**

The Trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the period from year ended 31 March 2017. The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, Accounting and reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) effective 1 January 2015.

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The church was constituted as an incorporated charitable organization on 22 May 2015 and with effect from 30 September 2015, assumed, by way of transfer, the assets and undertakings carried out by a charitable trust (registered number 1140846) also known as Ark Community Church Sutton Coldfield.

The objectives of the organisation are to advance the Christian faith in accordance with the Evangelical Alliance statement of beliefs. The church may also fulfil such other purposes which are exclusively charitable and relate to the charitable work of the church.

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Trust's aims and objectives.

### ACHEIVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The church has continued to meet weekly for worship and fellowship throughout the year on a Sunday morning and has also continued to hold weekly house groups for prayer, bible study and fellowship. Regular attendance has increased and is now averaging approaching 50. The 'Place of Welcome' continues to provide fellowship and support to members of the local community and several outreach events have taken place to build links between the church and the wider community and these have been well received

Outreach to youth in the community has continued with fellowship, and discipleship meetings taking place regularly. We have also continued to provide a weekly after -school drop-in during school term time. A large group attended Soul Survivor & Momentum and three local youth celebrations were organized with other churches from the area culminating with a mission week held in local schools in conjunction with the Message Trust. Children's activities have also continued during the period and are now held weekly.

The Stepping Stones projects aimed at helping adults with learning difficulties and which comprise two café's run for the public and weekly sessions on art and craft have continued to operate successfully.

The church continues to support several mission partners working both in this country and abroad. Our links with the church in Brasov, Romania have continued with two mission visits undertaken during the year.

### **REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES (continued)**

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The church is a charitable incorporated organization incorporated on 22 May 2015. The Trustees who served during the period and since the period end are as follows;

Trustees meet at least four times a year and are responsible for overall governance of the organization and keep under review its policies and practices. The Trustees have the power to appoint and remove Trustees in accordance with the provisions in the constitution and they keep their skill requirements under review and provide induction procedures relevant to the individuals' knowledge and understanding.

### FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### **Financial performance**

Unrestricted income for the church for the year was up 8% compared with the previous year. Expenditure was up 9%. Overall there was a small surplus after transfers and unrealised gains on investments. The church also achieved a small surplus on its Stepping Stones activities. Overall funds of £97,402 are being carried forward of which £33,076 relate to restricted funds.

#### **Reserves policy**

The trustees seek to limit unrestricted reserves and restricted reserves in respect of its Stepping Stones projects to no more than one year's budgeted regular expenditure. They aim to apply other restricted reserves to the specific activities within a twelve-month period.

#### **Risk policy**

The Trustees have identified certain risks to which the charity was exposed as part of their responsibilities in running the church. The main risks related to ensuring robust governance policies and practices are maintained and in its financial activities. The trustees regularly review these areas.

# **RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES**

The trustees are responsible for the preparation of the trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards.

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume the charity will continue in business.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

#### **1** Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

#### (a) <u>Basis of preparation</u>

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015.

#### (b) <u>Income</u>

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item of income has been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### (c) <u>Expenditure</u>

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third part, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified as on charitable activities, costs of raising funds or other costs.

#### (d) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of the charity.

Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified to be solely used for a particular purpose.

#### (e) <u>Tangible fixed assets</u>

Individual fixed assets costing £500 or more are capitalised at cost and are depreciated over their estimated useful economic lives on a straight-line basis as follow; Equipment 3 years

## 12 Related party transactions

The charity enjoys a close working relationship with Mere Green Chapel, a registered charity that owns the premises from which the church operates. Ark provided funding of £8,500 (2016 £45,000) during the year to enable the property to be refurbished and paid a total of £4,200 (2016 £3,700) towards running costs.

The total amount of Trustees donations was £19,514, (2016 6 months £10,115.)
