Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Report from Linda Grixti (Chair Stanton Woodland and Wildlife Action Group) for the year 2016 / 2017

"It was interesting to see in our slide show how our community woodland, "Sid's Piece", has developed over the last nine years. From oak saplings planted by the village's school children, a gradual maturing into a rich and varied habitat. This year has seen a change of our status to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation and thus we have been able to transfer ownership of the woodland from where it was held in trust to Stanton Woodland and Wildlife Action Group itself. Our constitution has been changed to be in line with this. A huge thank you to our secretary, Mark, for all his hard work.

We were all very sad to lose Rosie, our former secretary, who had done so much for the group since its formation. Her funeral was one of the nicest I have ever been to, and perfectly reflected who she was and what she loved. We will plant one of her favourite willows this autumn. We have had two fundraising events at Wyken Hall since our last AGM. Both were successful, but this year's Plants and Crafts was our best attended ever, helped no doubt by the almost perfect weather. Everyone seemed to enjoy it, the variety of stalls worked well and most did good business. Ian T will have the financial details in his treasurer's report. Thank you all for your contributions which make it all possible, especially Mary Jane for finding the volunteer stewards, and Ian S for all the publicity. Special thanks to our patron, Sir Kenneth, and Lady Carlisle for allowing us to use their fabulous grounds as our venue once again.

I am glad to report we have re-established contact with Stanton Community Primary School since it's reopening at the new premises. They have started an outdoor classroom with the help of the Green Light Trust, and have used some of our willow withies to make a living fence. It is great to see their enthusiasm. We hope that we can build on this during the coming years and that we will be able to make contributions towards their funds. Thanks also to the PTA who helped at the Wyken fair, for which made them a donation.

Maintenance of our community woodland has continued over the autumn and winter months during Sunday morning work parties. Most of the work has been coppicing and clearing. Last year we employed a tree surgeon to remove some of the larger willow trees and will continue with this until the oaks grow much bigger. During the summer the paths have been regularly strimmed and brambles cut back. Monitoring of the barn owl box and the Great British Elm Experiment continue.
