Trustees' Report

The trustees, who are directors for the purposes of company law, present the annual report together with the financial statements of the charitable company for the year ended 31 December 2016.

Objectives and activities

Objects and aims

The company's objective, for which the charity was established, is to preserve the locomotive engine shed at Barrow Hill, Staveley, which is Britain's only surviving operational roundhouse. A roundhouse is an engine shed featuring a central turntable, which is used to turn locomotives and to give access to numerous storage tracks within the building. The site is operated as a museum and also provides locomotive storage and repair and maintenance facilities to commercial operators.

Barrow Hill Limited is a 100% owned trading subsidiary of Barrow Hill Engine Shed Society Limited, and provides funds for the parent company by gift aid. All trading activities are undertaken by Barrow Hill Limited, with the charity being responsible for the major restoration and enhancement of the site and buildings.

Public benefit

The charity carries out its activities in order to bring benefit to the general public. It brings real historical and educational value as it aims to educate the public about the history of the site in various ways. There is now a very strong Museum and Archives department which stages regular public displays and exhibitions. Barrow Hill is an Accredited Museum, recognised as such by Arts Council England under their Accreditation Scheme for museums. The site is open to the public each weekend. A small admission charge was introduced during the year.

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the requirements of section 4 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

Trustees' Report

Achievements and performance

During 2016, the Society was advised by the Heritage Lottery Fund that it had been successful in its bid for Phase 2 funding of £1,170,600 in connection with its "Moving Forward" project which aims to improve facilities and attract a wider audience to visit and enjoy the site. Some spending was incurred during the year and the first instalment of £25,766 of this grant was also received. Major work on refurbishing the premises and constructing a building to house a new cafe commenced early in 2017.

Other grants received in 2016 were the final instalment of £4,954 of the Phase 1 funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund, the first instalment of £24,500 from the Arts Council of a £49,000 grant awarded towards the cost of writing and producing a Community Play entitled "Down the line" which is to be staged in 2017 and tells the story of Barrow Hill Roundhouse, and £1,500 from the Adult and Communities Development Fund of the Arts Council-funded "Museum Development East Midlands" to enable the Society to fund improved facilities for museum objects.

Due to preparations for the "Moving Forward" project work, the subsidiary company held only one major special event during the year. However, the event and storage income from the subsidiary's commercial arm facilitated another significant donation to the charity, at a higher level than the previous year.

Some Loan Notes were donated to the Society in 2011 and during 2016, the Trustees, after taking the appropriate advice, accepted an offer of £75,000 for these. This amount is included under the heading "Gain on Investment Assets".

Capital expenditure of £40,584 was incurred during the year. This included £25,901 incurred on fees, particularly Architects' fees, associated with the "Moving Forward" project .

Expenditure on repairs includes amounts spent on the annual contribution to maintaining the bridge over Whittington Road, and repairing the Drewry diesel locomotive and the turntable.

Financial review

The reserves policy of the Council of Management is to maximise income so as to provide reserves for the further development and refurbishment of the site and to enable major repairs to be carried out. Closing reserves of £525,812 are sufficient for this purpose.

Policy on reserves

The Charity's reserves policy is to attempt to ensure that there are sufficient funds available to meet the anticipated expenditure requirements for a minimum period of 12 months.

Structure, governance and management

Nature of governing document

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee and it was incorporated on 21st May 1997. The company was established under a Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Recruitment and appointment of trustees

New trustees are either elected by the Council of Management at a Trustees' Meeting or they are elected at the Annual General Meeting. Additional Trustees may be co-opted during the year by the Council of Management subject to their re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Trustees' Report

Induction and training of trustees

New Trustees are inducted at their first Council of Management meeting when the operation of the Charity is explained to them. They are also given copies of the minutes of previous meetings and relevant Charity Commission publications. New Trustees are familiar with the annual accounts as they are required to be members of the Charity when they are appointed and whilst they serve on the Council of Management.

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2016

1 Charity status

The charity is a charity limited by guarantee and consequently does not have share capital. Each of the trustees is liable to contribute an amount not exceeding £5 towards the assets of the charity in the event of liquidation.

2 Accounting policies

Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Basis of preparation

Barrow Hill Engine Shed Society Limited meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

The accounts are presented in sterling and rounded to the nearest pound.

Going concern

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern nor any significant areas of uncertainty that affect the carrying value of assets held by the charity.

Exemption from preparing a cash flow statement

The charity opted to adopt Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016 and have therefore not included a cash flow statement in these financial statements.

Exemption from preparing group accounts

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in section 398 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements, on the grounds that it is a small sized group.

Income and endowments

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of the income receivable can be measured reliably.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2016

Donations and legacies

Donations are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance by the charity before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until either those conditions are fully met, or the fulfilment of those conditions is wholly within the control of the charity and it is probable that these conditions will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

Grants receivable

Grants are recognised when the charity has an entitlement to the funds and any conditions linked to the grants have been met. Where performance conditions are attached to the grant and are yet to be met, the income is recognised as a liability and included on the balance sheet as deferred income to be released.

Investment income

Investment income is recognised on a receivable baisis.

Expenditure

All expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to that expenditure, it is probable settlement is required and the amount can be measured reliably. All costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure heading that aggregate similar costs to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of resources, with central staff costs allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use. Other support costs are allocated based on the spread of staff costs.

Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Governance costs

These include the costs attributable to the charity's compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements, including audit, strategic management and trustees's meetings and reimbursed expenses.

Taxation

The charity is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 of the Finance Act 2010 and therefore it meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes. Accordingly, the charity is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income or capital gains received within categories covered by Chapter 3 Part 11 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992, to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2016

Tangible fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £500 or more are initially recorded at cost, less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments relate to the subsidiary company and are included at cost.

Trade debtors

Trade debtors are amounts due from customers for merchandise sold or services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Trade debtors are recognised initially at the transaction price, less provision for impairment. A provision for the impairment of trade debtors is established when there is objective evidence that the charity will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Trade creditors

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if the charity does not have an unconditional right, at the end of the reporting period, to defer settlement of the creditor for at least twelve months after the reporting date. If there is an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting date, they are presented as non-current liabilities.

Trade creditors are recognised initially at the transaction price.

Fund structure

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees's discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Restricted income funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.
