Trustees are appointed at the Annual General Meeting for a period of three years at a time.

In addition, the charity is administered in accordance with the rules and regulations for University clubs as published from time to time by the Proctors of the University of Oxford.

Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The object of the charity is the relief of children who are in necessitous circumstances in particular, but not exclusively, through the provision of free holidays for deprived children from the Oxford area.

The considered children are recommended by Social Services and/or by any other organisation that may come into contact with deprived children.

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects

The focus of the charity's activities is on children.

Each year the charity runs two week-long holidays for children living in the Oxford area in order to give them a break from whatever difficulties they may be experiencing.

The holidays are designed to allow the children to have fun and try new things, building confidence along the way but always allowing them to be children.

The charity welcomes all children aged from 7-12 years regardless of gender, race or religion.

Additional details of objectives and activities

A great contribution is made by the member volunteers and the charity is grateful to them for giving up their summer holidays to lead the vacations for the children.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year.

The holidays this year were again held at St Katharine's in Parmoor - a residential centre that hosts projects like ours.

The venue has wonderful grounds where the children could play organised games with the leaders as well as being a place of historic beauty that allowed the children to stay somewhere out of the ordinary.

Each week's activities were carefully planned, with a range of age-appropriate activities available; for instance, children could do everything from feeding goats at Odds Farm to earning a mock driver's licences at Legoland.

Additionally, in 2016 we expanded the project to hold one-day away days for children - outside of our normal week long holidays. This has only been possible due to the continued support of our benefactors.

The charity is looking forward to its 46th year of operating in 2017 - and further forward is now planning an third weeks holiday for 2018 due to an exceptional fund-raising in the past 2-3 years.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

We aim to hold at least half a year's worth of costs in the reserve accounts to cushion the charity in the event of a poor year of fundraising.

As our financial year end falls in the middle of our fund raising year, the cash at bank figure of £37,070 appears artificially high, as this includes funds raised for the 2017 holiday that has not happened yet.

Furthermore, with the reserves we have we plan for an additional weeks holiday in 2018 - it was hoped to do this in 2017, but the long lead time to secure accommodation mean that this has slipped to 2018.
