### **PCC Treasurer's Report 2016**

Before I move onto the numbers, I'd like to firstly thank every single one of you for your, frankly, overwhelming support to St Pauls, as you will know the 2015 accounts didn't make for positive reading as we completed the year in deficit by nearly £9,000. However this year Luke, I and the rest of the PCC are so very grateful to the congregation for your generosity this year in terms of one off donations, support for fundraising and your regular pledges... these, as you will see from the following, have helped turn the 2016 finances for St Pauls into much more positive reading.

If I can firstly turn your attention to the Statement of Financial Activity on pages 4 & 5. As you will see income from Collections and Planned Giving has increased by over 12% on last year, an incredible £7,164. This follows the pledge day back in May, which had an amazing response and saw committed giving pledges generously increased. You will also see a significant increase in donations this year, a total of £7,744 which is more than double that of 2015, an increase of nearly £4,500. So again, thank you so much for your generosity and support to the Church.

We have just received a further Gift Aid claim for part of 2016 totalling £10,200 which will be accounted for in 2017, added to the £12,219 already claimed and accounted for in 2016.

Other significant increases in income are for; Weddings, Funerals and Memorials due to the increase in funerals and inscriptions this year compared to 2015; Fundraising income has increased by 22% or £660 this year predominantly due to the Colour & Light Party, Highway 49 Concert and Family Olympic Fun Day - thank you to all those who organised these fund raising events, it is much appreciated by the PCC. The Parish Hall accounts also had an increase in income this year in rental income/lettings to the tune of £6,725.

Parish Hall payments of £3,600 are represented in the Church Property income this year although was allocated to Other Parish Income in 2015, hence the variances in these lines.

We raised £1,457 for Outside Charities paid through the PCC account; we also made further Charitable donations totalling £2,275 to Umoja Street Child, Mustard Seed Appeal, Street Pastors and Joel Project.

Further contributing to the improved financial position this year is the reduction in Total Expenditure of £16,334 compared with 2015; this is despite the increased charitable donations mentioned above (an increase of £3,376 compared to 2015). Payments to the Diocese totalled £47,483 a reduction of £12,664 which was negotiated by Luke at the beginning of 2016. It is worth noting however that our 2017 pledge has been raised to £52,600.

Other significant decreases in expenditure has been in Heat, Light & Water Rates due to a change in provider, negotiated by Joanne – we thank you for this; Repairs & Renewals, because we had more repairs done on the grounds and property in 2015 which included re-pointing, garage and pluming work; and also a reduction in Ordinary Parish Expenditure, due to one offs in 2015 that we didn't see in 2016, such as; audit costs for the 2014 accounts (our 2015 and 2016 audits have been performed by a friend of Rachel Whitelaw, a parishioner at St George's, Tolworth, for free. I would like to thank George Mitchell and Rachel for their time and support in this regard); one off gifts, costs of the vicarage during the period between Chris leaving and Luke joining us, and the welcome buffet for Luke.

All of the above means we ended 2016 in credit by £30,598.

Moving to the Balance Sheet on pages 2 & 3, this represents the cash we hold in our bank accounts. This totals £102,594 split between the Church accounts of £60,429 and the Parish Hall accounts of £42,165.

On Page 3 of the Balance Sheet you will notice a significant change in the presentation of our Unrestricted Designated Funds. Following discussion with the Diocese and PCC it was agreed that we needed to represent the true nature of the cash we hold in our bank accounts, the only remaining true legacy we retain is the Mary Wise Fund held in the CBF deposit account of £16,572. Given the deficits of previous years, in actual fact these unrestricted funds have been expended. This is a presentational issue only and does not reflect any significant reduction in our cash position, which as stated, has grown to a healthy balance of £102,594, an increase of £30,598, i.e. the surplus income made in 2016.

This concludes my report on the finances. Can I please once again thank you all on behalf of Luke and the rest of the PCC for your continued support and generosity.

### INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL OF ST. PAUL'S HOOK

This report on the accounts of the Parochial Church Council for the year ended 31st December 2016, which are set out on pages two to six, is in respect of an examination carried out under the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 and S.145 of the Charities Act 2011.

### RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES AND EXAMINERS

As the members of the Parochial Church Council you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts; you consider that the audit requirement of the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 and section 14(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act) do not apply and that an independent examination is needed.

It is our responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity commissioners section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- state whether particular matters have come to our attention.

### BASIS OF INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

Our examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. That examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the Parochial Church Council and a comparison of the accounts with those records. It also includes considering any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently we do not express an audit opinion on the view given by these accounts.
