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#### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2017. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

The object of the League is to relieve patients of the Hospital who are sick, convalescent, disabled, handicapped or infirm and, generally, to support the charitable work of the HospItal. There are no restrictions to limit the League's activities. There are no specific investment powers

#### Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Trust's aims and objectives and in planning future performance.

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

The Charity has continued to meet its objectives during the year by providing amenities for the hospital; the amenities cost a total of £97,525 (2016: £40,229).

#### **Fundraising activities**

The Charity has organised several major fund-raising events during the year which, together with some smaller events, have raised a net £10,435 (2016: £14,041). A great deal of hard work is undertaken by the Committee and by other volunteers who assist at our events.

#### **Trading activities**

During the year, the Charity continued to operate its shop and cafeteria facilities at the Hospital. These facilities raised a net £18,472 (2016:£20,132).

#### **Legacies and Donations**

During the financial year, the Charity received two substantial legacies; one of £100,000 from the estate of the late Mrs M Surgey and the other of £43,000 from the estate of the late Mr H. J. White.The Trustees have publicly acknowledged these generous gifts, for which the Charity is most grateful.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### Reserves policy

Sufficient reserves are maintained to cover a full year's administrative costs; funds are utilised only after they have been raised.

#### **FUTURE PLANS**

The Trustees continue to publicise the work of the Charity to try to increase membership, and believe that the Charity is well-placed to meet the needs of patients and staff in the Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother Hospital.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

The Charity is governed by constitution as amended in October 1998, and is an unincorporated charity.

### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New members are sought at all fundraising activities and applications are duly vetted before appointment at a majority vote.

#### Organisational structure

The Charity is run by a Committee of members who meet monthly at the Hospital. All the members are Trustees and all are volunteers who receive no remuneration.

The Charity is a member of the national umbrella organisation "Attend".

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2017 set out on pages four to ten.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows;
- the requirement of Section 3 Financial Statement Presentation paragraph 3.17(d).

The Trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

#### Changes in accounting policies

In preparing the accounts, the trustees have considered whether, in applying the accounting policies required by FRS102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102, a restatement of comparative items was needed.

The Trustees consider that no such restatement was required.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Voluntary income includes subscriptions, donations and legacies. Legacies are accounted for as soon as the charity is notified of its legal entitlement, the amount is quantifiable and its receipt by the charity is reasonably certain.

No income has been deferred.

No income has been included in the financial statements net of expenditure.

No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis, and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Raising funds

Raising funds includes all expenditure incurred by the charity to raise funds for its charitable purposes and includes costs of all fundraising activities, events and non-charitable trading.

#### Charitable activities

The cost heading " Charitable activities" represents costs incurred in achieving the stated objectives of the charity

#### **Governance costs**

"Governance costs" relate to the running of the charity as a legal entity and include costs that do not contribute to fund raising or achieving the charity's objectives.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
